2) What's Moving vs. What Sits

Luxury coastal homes that are priced correctly, professionally presented, and clearly documented tend to sell faster. Overpriced homes, dated interiors at premium price points, and properties with unclear insurance or maintenance history typically remain on the market longer.

Common “moves faster” traits:

- Strong presentation (photo/video) and a clear value story in the first 14 days.
- Buyer-ready documentation: updates, elevation/context, and clear disclosures.
- Competitive positioning against current inventory (what buyers can buy this week).

Common “sits longer” traits:

- Launch price above the true competitive set; leads to reductions and weaker leverage.
- Dated interiors at a luxury price; unclear scope of required updates.

- Insurance uncertainty not addressed early (wind/flood questions appear during underwriting).

3) Buyer Leverage Insights

With increased inventory and more frequent price reductions, buyers currently have meaningful leverage in many Galveston price segments. Homes with longer days on market or prior price reductions generally offer stronger negotiation opportunities, while well-positioned listings can still command attention.
