My first fiction award was a creative writing credit linked to my English Literature A-level ((GCE). Main writing interests (Novelist, Poet, Playwright, Biographer, Historian, Academic, Researcher, other etc?)	My main writing interests cover quite a wide range. First and foremost I write fiction. My first crime novel 'Death is Waiting' was published in 2023. I have also written a report on pottery finds for an archaeological dig, a dissertation on The Royal Manor of Watford in Tudor times and a background social history section for 'Dance Through History' a history of dance and costume through the ages with two other authors.
Do you have a special place in which to write?	I have my Plotting Shed at the bottom of the garden which I use depending on the weather. My daughter kindly had a sign made which is proudly displayed over the door. Otherwise anywhere I can put pen to paper for the initial draft. I also write the occasional poem for our group's monthly competitions.
Do you have a preferred time of day for writing?	Not a specific time as such, I am not that organised. I try to write something each day. I am usually up quite early and tend to think about the plot or character actions then. The writing is usually done in the afternoons.

The Old Peculiar Crime Writers Festival has been a regular trip for me for several years now including the excellent Creative Thursdays. What writing project are you currently working on (or intend to start)?	I have another DCI Mortmain story brewing about yet another murder which will be the third in the series.
Do you have other interests? and/or member of other groups/societies?	My once first love is History which I taught for twenty years. I am a member of the National Trust. Gardening is also a hobby but my finest crop is usually the weeds that do not really need my help to flourish.
