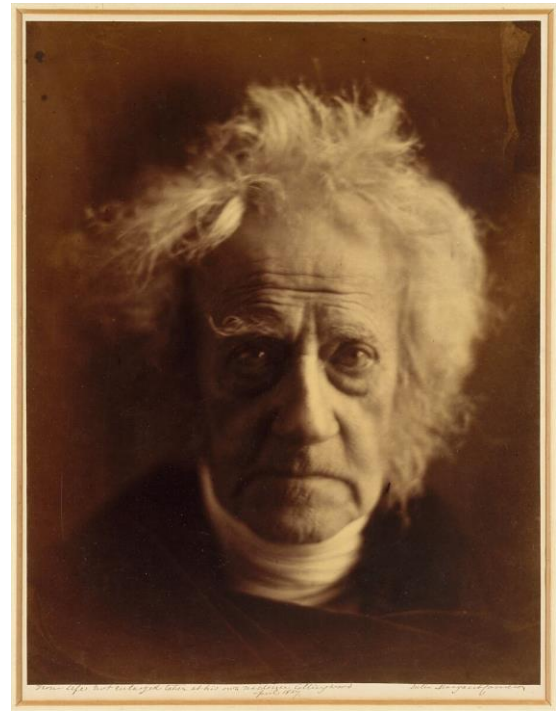


AI DISTURBS
