1 Purpose of Document

This document outlines the approach that FPM has adopted to acquire politically exposed persons' (PEP) data for AML/CFT screening purposes. It also details the scope of domestic data being acquired by FPM under this approach, and the organization structure that supports the acquisition and delivery of the politically exposed persons' information.

2 Introduction

Since 2019, FPM has been extensively engaged with numerous businesses in Pakistan, facilitating their AML/CFT compliance teams in addressing common challenges.

One of the biggest lacking that FPM identified through its meticulous research, was the unavailability of credible information about domestic PEPs. FPM research team evaluated one after another world's top, off-the-shelf sources for domestic PEPs information but all the efforts were to no avail.


Finally FPM decided to step forward and build a comprehensive, credible archive of information about domestic PEPs. In a very short timeframe, FPM research team succeeded in acquiring information about tens of thousands of domestic PEPs with the quality of data on par with (or even above) that of other popular providers.


FPM domestic PEPs data acquisition policies are fully compliant with the guidelines given by international bodies, and the mechanism adopted for this purpose is based on the global best practices. The above stated objective is achieved by examining the most authoritative PEP definitions as outlined by:

- 1. The United Nations Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC)
- 2. Financial Action Task Force (FATF)
- 3. The European Union Fourth Anti-Money Laundering Directive
- 4. The UK Money Laundering, Terrorist Financing and Transfer of Funds (Information on the Payer) Regulations
- 5. The Joint Anti Money Laundering Steering Group (JMLSG)
- 6. The Wolfsburg Group

FPM Domestic PEPs Database is by far the largest collection of PEPs from Pakistan. It is instrumental in curbing corruption and money laundering risks with respect to domestic norms.

4 FPM PEPs' Classification

FPM has structured its' PEP data in accordance with the definition of PEP given by FATF. Moreover, FPM has further expanded its coverage to the areas which are significant for AML compliance in consideration to the domestic norms of the country. 5 Domestic PEPs Attributes

For FPM Domestic PEPs, following attributes are available in general for a large number of data records:

- Full Name
- Father Name
- CNIC
- Home Town, City, District
- Profession/Job Title
- Date of Birth
- Date of appointment and promotion
- Department, or institution
- Sources from where information was obtained
- Time reference when information was recorded or updated

6 PEPs' Data Ownership

PEPs' data being used by FPM for AML screening purposes is acquired from various government, administrative, and third party sources. The data sources are assessed carefully for authenticity and correctness. The data obtained from these sources goes through a series of transformations before it is compiled into a form suitable for screening job. The ownership of this data in its compiled form is retained by FPM and its partners solely.

7 PEPs' Data Acquisition and Update

FPM would like to express its commitment for continually expanding the coverage of the Domestic PEPs data. We welcome our clients' recommendations for further inclusion of authentic sources of information to the scope of FPM PEPs data acquisition. FPM Domestic PEPs have enough searchable criteria to help identifying true matches.

FPM PEPs data is obtained in good faith from sources which FPM and its partners consider to be reliable, however such data is not independently verified by FPM or its partners. Thereof, the use of FPM PEPs data by a client is at its sole risk; and FPM does not guarantee accuracy, completeness, correctness, timeliness of the data.

In terms of data maintenance, PEP sources where frequent data updates are expected, FPM research team keeps a constant watch through automated or semi-automated means and any new information found, is scheduled for acquisition on immediate basis.

Sources where information is made available at regular intervals, data acquisition is planned accordingly. In cases of existing PEPs data where no new information is anticipated, the default review cycle is planned every 6 months.
