However, in talking with Barry Maples, ALR Department Chairman it appears that the Turkey Run will go on as scheduled. In October, a total of 20,731 messages were sent nationwide. Of those, Kansas took the top spot again with 2,124 messages sent, or 10.2% of the overall total - nearly 500 more than the #2 Department!

#### Pay Our Troops!

The American Legion is asking the American Legion Family to contact Congress to urge them to pass the *Pay Our Troops Act!* This legislation ensures that members of the Armed Services will be paid in the event of a government shutdown.

#### Government Shutdown Information: (Excerpted from the American Legion Legislative Weekly)

The American Legion's Government Affairs office is working diligently to keep the Legion Family updated on news related to the government shutdown, which has been in effect since October 1. The most recent vote in the Senate on 10/22 failed 54-46.

On October 14th, The American Legion participated in a joint press conference with other MSO/VSOs to call on Congress to open government and pass the Pay Our Troops Act. You can watch Executive Director Mario Marquez's remarks <a href="here">here</a>.

#### Message from Finance Officer Michael Saindon,

Did you know every year the Detachment of Kansas gives out five - \$500 scholarships and 1 - \$1,000 scholarships?

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- 1. The applicant should be an average or better student scholastically.
- 2. High School seniors, undergraduate college students, and adults holding High School Diplomas and/or College credits who are enrolled or intend to enroll in an approved Junior College, College, University or Trade School located in the state of Kansas will be considered.
- 3. The applicant must be the son, daughter, grandson, or granddaughter of a member of the Kansas Sons of the American Legion or a member of the Kansas Sons of the American Legion for the past three (3) consecutive years. (Please attach copy of current year's membership card of the member from whom eligibility is derived.) SAL members who are US citizens are eligible to apply.
- 4. The applicant may obtain eligibility through a deceased member whose membership was paid up in The Sons of the American Legion in the year of death. (Please attach certification from Squadron Adjutant.)

#### **HOW TO APPLY:**

- 1. Applications must be received in The American Legion Headquarters, 1314 Topeka Ave., Topeka, KS 66612, by February 15.
- 2. All requested support documents and information in a single envelope deliverable by USPS.
- 3. Copy of current membership card in the Kansas Sons of the American Legion or Adjutant's certification.

#### Get One For The Legion!

This program rewards Sons of the American Legion members for doing the work and supporting the American Legion, while the Legion gets the new members and continues to grow their membership and stay alive and active. *And the whole American Legion Family benefits:* Every time the Legion gains a new member, chances are there are family members that are eligible to join the Auxiliary, Sons, Riders and Cruisers.

How it works: Any SAL member (regular, dual, or triple) that recruits a NEW legion member gets a polo shirt courtesy of the Detachment of Kansas. The detachment pays for the shirts and the embroidery. On one side of the shirt, it is embroidered with "Got One For The Legion Family" and on the other side it is embroidered with the SAL logo/emblem. The shirts were designated to be a bright neon color for two reasons: 1) When you know the program and see someone wearing the shirt, you know they signed up a new legion member 2) It is a great conversation starter for people unaware of the program. The shirt color will change each year, but will be a bright color to draw attention to the program.
