SPOTLIGHT ON: ANN HAMMOND

Introducing the new Sonoma County Library Director!

Ann Hammond will start her new job as Sonoma County Library Director on March 11th. She will be coming to us from Lexington, Kentucky where she was the Executive Director of the Lexington Public Library for the last 8 years.

Hammond, who is native to San Diego, is looking forward to coming back to California where she previously served in leadership roles in San Diego and Alameda counties. She has also worked in Florida and Maryland.

Hammond is a veteran of the U.S. Navy and once worked as a forensic scientist. She has been working continuously in libraries since 1995. She looks back fondly on her library mentor, Deanna Marcum who was then the Dean of the library school at Catholic University in Washington, DC, and convinced her that she should be a librarian. Hammond said, "She was right, there is no place in our society that is as positive and welcoming as a public library and I feel honored to be a librarian."

There are two things that Hammond says she wants our North Bay communities to know before she starts her new job: She has a lot of enthusiasm for implementing new technology in libraries and she intends to create new partnerships with our Cities and Sonoma County.


