SPOTLIGHT ON: DIY TOOLKIT

This is a program that started at a few libraries including Guerneville Regional Library a couple of years ago, but I wanted to highlight it again because of our continuing need to be more energy efficient.

The contents of the toolkit, which can be borrowed, will help you take charge of your home's energy and water use in order to reduce your utility bills. The user guide will walk you through each step and enable you to calculate your estimated savings. It will also provide additional "tips" for "going green" in your daily life.

Some of the items will be yours to keep and install in your home such as LED lightbulbs and faucet aerators.

Other items must be returned in the toolkit carrier such as the various thermometers and the user guide.



Dr. Marie H. Schaap was a long-time volunteer with the River Friends of the Library. Many folks who have been with our organization awhile knew and enjoyed her. She passed away peacefully at the age of 93 on October 28, 2019.

She lived in Monte Rio since 1959. She raised four children and is survived by two sons and their wives and a daughter and her husband, several grandchildren, as well as other family members. Marie was preceded in death by her husband Charles and son Dr. Kevin M. Schaap.

Marie was a doctor who graduated from the College of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons in Southern California. She was an Aviation Medical Examiner and was a U.S. Army Reserves physician. She had a long career practicing medicine locally.

She was active in the Guerneville Senior Center and was appreciative of the work of the Monte Rio Fire Department.
