Transport Yourself to the Shores of the Mediterranean - Where Music and Passion Collide!
A Conversation with Professional Musician
Johnny Bacolas

he Eastside is the place to be for Rumba.
Lifelong musician, Johnny Bacolas, is a cofounder of the musical group, *The Rumba Kings* and has performed extensively on
the eastside (Bellevue and Kirkland), while
getting established. The eastside is where our roots are; we
developed, cultivated, and evolved our stage show on these
stages. We performed at Kirkland Performance Center three
times just prior to the pandemic, and plan on returning soon.
So, we've entertained the eastside for about the past 7 years.

#### The early years

At 12 years old I began playing guitar and stopped playing sports. I dove deep into my new passion (the guitar and music). I attended Shorewood High in North Seattle. I started my first group here, which was an early incarnation of the group Alice in Chains (spelled Alice 'N Chains at that time). I'm listed on Shorewood High's Wikipedia page as a "Notable Alumni" because of the musical groups I'm connected to and my involvement in music in High School. Later, in my early 20's myself and the drummer of Alice 'N Chains formed the heavy-rock post-grunge group, Second Coming, which signed to Capitol Records in May of 1998. ## Can you describe how you found your passion for music?

My parents were Greek Immigrants. They met at St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church in Seattle. My brother, Timmy Bacolas, and I are our family's first generation born in America. My father, George Bacolas, was a restauranter. One of my favorite stories is what inspired me to be a musician. When I was young, (around age 4-5) he owned a tavern in Seattle



called "Kings Tucks." He would bring home the 45's from the juke box that ran their course in the top 40, when they were rotated out. Every couple of months he would bring home a box of 45 records, which I immediately gravitated to, and would obsessively play them on our family stereo in our living room. This is where my deep love for music was sparked. The melodies and string arrangements in those 70's songs by Elton John, Barry Manilow, various Motown songs, and others, really hit me hard, to the point of inspiring me to be a musician. I credit these early influences for my writing-style, playing, and production to this day.

#### Where do you credit your artistic talent?

My mother, she is an amazing artist! She paints, primarily nature paintings, abstracts, and Greek island paintings. Her home is in Kirkland and looks like an art gallery. Her paintings line every wall in her home. My home is full of her art as well. She has a website featuring her work at www.patriciabacolas.com

#### Tell us about your travel and passions as a musician

I have traveled extensively throughout the US while touring in my group Second Coming, which was signed to Capitol Records. I've performed in almost every state in the US and have been to 49 states. Annually, I like to go to Greece. Greece

is one of my other passions. I've filmed about 9 music videos on the Greek Islands and around the mainland. I also work with several musicians in Greece, who record on our Rumba Kings' recordings.

While I'm there I'll spend a great deal of time in recording studios, filming music vids (The most recent being for the single, "Love from Mykonos") and just enjoying life in this beautiful country. I love visiting the Greek islands, one of my other passions. I also love visiting a small mountain village called "Mili" where my mom spent her summers as a little girl, and subsequently, brought my brother and I there when we were children to spend parts of our summers there. It's



like travelling back in time being in Mili. Not a lot has changed since we were kids. I love the smell in the air of the wood burning stoves and even the smell of the livestock nearby. I love the simplicity and the quiet of the mountain villages in Greece.

## Would you give us a behind-the-scenes look into the life of a musician?


I don't have a lot of hobbies. I work around the clock being self-employed. Since I wear so many hats in my organization (The Rumba Kings), I neither have time for outside hobbies, nor the mental energy. Music is my hobby, my work, my passion. It's what I love doing more than anything else. It would be my hobby even if I wasn't doing it professionally. With that said, I would love to someday soon, not wear so many hats (i.e. musician, music producer, music video producer and director, editor, recording engineer, all business affairs, hiring/ finding/training musicians, musical director of live performances, scheduling, budgeting & forecasting,

I do have a soft spot for cats and have a beautiful 13 ½ year old Tabby named "Cheetah" that I've had since she was 6 weeks old. I love all animals, but really love cats!

I've lived on the Eastside for 30 years because I love the area primarily because I love being so close to the water. In the summer, the area sometimes reminds me of a small Southern California beach town. I love the nature I'm surrounded by here and being by the lake. I feel this is one of the most beautiful areas in the state.

## A world-wide journey and realization of a dream

My musical career has taken me on an




amazing journey. I've met some of the most fascinating people in the world, performed around the world, and at 54, I have the same passion and love for what I do as when I was 16 years old. I feel that everything I've gone through in life has prepared me for the next chapter, and that's to take the show I've built with my biz partner, George Stevens, all over the world. I feel we've created the most beautiful show on earth! This group and the show we've produced has been my dream since I was 21, when I saw Yanni perform for

the first time with a large orchestra. I was fortunate to meet Yanni that night and it was like a ton of bricks hitting me! I dreamed of creating a show even more beautiful, with a Mediterraneaninspired theme, and with Spanish guitar being the focal point, instead of piano. With a full orchestra behind us like he did and producing & performing music that was emotionally impacting and delivered in a spectacular show, with the best musicians, dancers, and guests vocalists on earth. Not a concert, but an experience, a show with passion!

I love living and performing on the Eastside (when the opportunity arises). I've performed at private parties with my group, The Rumba Kings, for some very extraordinary people this past year, in the Medina/Hunts Point area. 



# **Ask the Wine Expert**

"Should I be worried about the sulfite warning label on wines? I've noticed probably most of the wine I buy and drink has that on the label. I know a lot of friends who say they can't drink reds because of the sulfites!"

#### George, Bellevue

Sulfites are a preservative that lock on the clarity and freshness of a wine, and are present in all wines. Most wines state that sulfites are present as it's a natural occurrence in making wine – even wines that say "no sulfites added" have sulfites. They just don't add additional sulfites. While there's still sulfites, those with none added are always the lowest. If you get headaches or stuffy

from white wine, you most likely have sulfite allergies. If you have trouble with reds, occasionally people will react to tannin in red wines, but it's most often a problem with histamines, as reds are very high in histamines!

# Saints, Soldiers, and Secret Love: A **Compelling Look** Into the History of **Valentine's Day**

Cupid's arrow may only strike once a year, but the origins of Valentine's Day are a surprisingly messy entanglement of pagan rituals, martyred saints, and romantic ideals. While February 14th now radiates with love songs and heartshaped candy that's a little too sweet, its history shares tales of fertility festivals, secret letters, and even matchmaking birds. But where did it start, and how did it become popular today?

Let's rewind to ancient Rome, where Lupercalia, a loud and exciting festival, was held on February 15th. Held in dedication to the Roman God of Agriculture, Faunus, it was a grandiose event. It was seen as a time for matchmaking, where the young men and women would pair up for the rest of the celebration, sometimes leading to lifelong unions. It was around the 5th century, amidst the rise of Christianity, when Pope Gelasius I aimed to "Christianize" pagan festivities. Though the festival survived the initial rise, it was soon outlawed after being deemed "un-Christian." Gelasius went on to declare February 14th, (conveniently close to Lupercalia) St. Valentine's Day.

However, there's a twist: multiple Saint Valentines existed, and their stories vary wildly. Emperor Claudious II had discovered that young, unmarried men proved to be better soldiers, so he outlawed marriage altogether. Valentine saw the injustice and continued as a priest to secretly marrying couples against the emperor's decree. He knew that a loveless life was one of the most painful of all. When his actions were discovered, his ideals never faltered and he was sent to his death

by Claudious II. Another tells of a bishop, also martyred by Claudious II, who performed miracles for a Roman jailer's daughter, falling in love with her. It is alleged that his last letter to her was signed "from your Valentine," much like the tradition today.


Fast forward to the Middle Ages, and whispers of courtly love began to permeate Europe. February 14th took on a new meaning, coinciding with the supposed start of birds' mating season. Geoffrey Chaucer, the Bard himself, penned the first Valentine's Day poem called Parliament of Foules (Chaucer, 1375). Not to be confused with the first Valentine, which has a slightly more grim yet equally romantic tale. Sir Charles, Duke of Orleans had been captured after the Battle of Agincourt, and while imprisoned in the Tower of London, he wrote the first valentine to his wife.

By the 18th century, Valentine's Day truly bloomed, and Valentine's Day merchandise was not far behind. By 1900, handwritten cards gave way to mass-produced greetings, adorned with cupids, hearts, and flowery verses. Lovers of every class exchanged tokens of affection like chocolates and flowers, solidifying the holiday's connection to romantic gestures.

Today, Valentine's Day is a global phenomenon, celebrated with varying degrees of enthusiasm. For couples in Argentina, not only is it just a day of celebration, but a whole week (and celebrated in July). South Koreans celebrate it on the 14th of every month, having different

names for each event! One of the most intriguing celebrations takes place in Wales, where couples exchange unique, handcarved wooden spoons to each other in a testament to love and creativity.

Despite its commercialization and critiques of forced romance, Valentine's Day retains a certain charm. It's a day to celebrate love in all its forms, be it romantic, platonic, or love for good company and chocolate. So, whether you're exchanging sonnets or sharing pizza with friends, remember that the tangled history of Valentine's Day is a testament to the enduring human desire for connection and affection. And who knows, maybe that matchmaking magic of Lupercalia still lingers in the air, waiting to be rekindled with a modern twist.





So, if you're ever driving somewhere along the Columbia river on a weekend drive, look up in the hills for Legend, you might just see him flash by.





Some of the best exercise is free. (How much money does it cost to do a push up?) Nestled between houses and high rises lie funky hidden passages in the city. Often tucked away, these are the five best staircases providing transport, exercise, and an escape.

**Jose Rizal Park Stairs:** The triple 8's, name for its eight sets of 88 stairs. These stairs are located within a gated, off-leash dog park, providing a great workout for both you and your pooch. With eight stars at each run, experienced users double step by the evens (sets 2, 4, 6, 8). Keep you body inclined to the angle of the stair, and your chest and hips in alignment.

**Beacon Hill Stair Maze:** This is a popular set, from its location in downtown Seattle, and the destination of the red brick veteran's hospital sitting at the top of the hill. There's a total of 15 different staircases adding up to 161 stairs. Make sure you stretch and warm-up before tackling.

**Golden Garden Stairs:** Those looking for solitude and contemplation during their workout will be most pleased with these stairs. There are 287 steps gaining 325 feet in elevation, or a 42% grade. At the top, you are rewarded with post card views of the Olympic Mountains and Puget Sound waters. There's a number of short landings along the path, allowing you to break-up your workout.

I-5 Colonnade Stairs: For those that like a bit of urban grit with their workout, the Colonnade Park stairs are located in an open space underneath I5 between Howe Street and Lakeview Blvd. The path includes an off-leash dog park. The stairs themselves offer further connections to Eastlake and Capital Hill, as well as a mountain biking trail. There are two landing pads breaking up the entire climb, providing convenient points for three-minute breaks.

**Galor Traverse:** This is the grand daddy in Seattle, a whopping 967 steps. This is excellent training for those speeding up their 5K run, or practicing the Columbia Tower Stair Climb. You will climb over 500 feet in less than three-quarter of a mile. You can use the hand-rails to help propel you up the stairs.
