George Stevens and the Rumba Kings:

Bringing Passionate Music to the Eastside

he early years I grew up in a musical family based out of Southern California and was surrounded by incredible musicians. Almost everyone in my family was musically inclined, but I drew inspiration from my grandfather, Vine Stevens, who was a mandolin artist and my father, John Stevens, an accordion artist. At age 12, an internal fire was lit with the desire to be a musician, fueled by my grandfather's passing and the intent to carry on his legacy. My brother, Paul Stevens, and I along with my two cousins, Donny & Bobby Stevens, started a band called Vines boys playing traditional Serbian, Greek and Mediterranean style music. We did our best to emulate our grandfathers' style and unique sound, along the way, I came across the Rumba flamenco sound and style and blended it with Greek, Serbian and Spanish to create my own sound and style.

Describe your passion for music

I started playing professionally at age 14 at a Greek restaurant in Newport Beach (Zorba's). Along with my brother's

accompaniment on accordion and I on Bouzouki and Guitar, we were working three nights a week and getting paid \$75 each a night. It was a pretty good gig for 14-year-old in the early 90s, but the money was not the driving force behind at all. It was making people dance, it was making people smile, it was about helping people to enjoy themselves. The human impact is what gave me joy and deeply motivated me to be a professional musician. I was deeply motivated to find my own unique style and sound and by using these performances and private parties as a platform to develop just that. In the interim of searching for my own unique style and sound, I was deeply moved by the music that my brother and I were putting together, and it was very difficult for me to stay still and just play. I would dance with my guitar while I was playing and truly get lost in the music, this is where I became a performer and not just a musician.

Behind the scenes

I think everybody needs an escape from time to time in their lives. I love all types of outdoor activities such as fishing, golfing and hiking. I get a sense of tranquility when doing these activities, especially when I'm on or next to the water, that is truly my happy place. But most of all I enjoy spending time with family. I've been married for 28 years to a beautiful and

wonderful woman, we have two amazing daughters together, and two extremely vibrant dogs (also, my children) the dogs are also girls, so I found myself surrounded by females, which made me become a very patient, understanding and compromising

Home life

I had an arranged marriage at the tender age of 17 years old and it has been amazing. Of course, we've had our share of ups and downs, but overall, it's been fantastic! We both learned early on in our relationship that to have a solid foundation in anything there must be respect. Along with respect there must be compromise and communication. But without respect you cannot compromise or communicate respectfully. In 28 years of marriage, we have never said a foul word to each other. I find this to be a true blessing.

Influencers

At a young age, I had great admiration for my father, John Stevens and my grandfather Vine Stevens. Both of them were accomplished musicians and great family men with strong family values. I looked up to these men with great admiration and a sense of pride to be related to them. I was taught by them to have a strong work ethic. My father once told me "I am very lucky in business but the harder I work the luckier I get." My father and I used to love watching old movies of the rat pack, especially Dean Martin and Frank Sinatra. They had a unique sense of style and class that you just don't see anymore. I was also very fond of their music. I guess you could say that I try to

emulate them by incorporating their sense of stylish class in my musical performances. I was also influenced by the enchanting sounds of the Gipsy Kings, Ottmar Liebert and Stunz and Farah.

Worldwide dream

When I was young, I imagined myself becoming a real estate developer or an entrepreneur in the classic car business. My father was a real estate developer, and I wanted to be exactly like him but later learned that I can only learn from him, I could never be him. I've always had a passion for classic cars and started a classic car business when I was a teenager, buying, restoring and selling American muscle cars. I enjoyed doing this very much for I had a deep appreciation for muscle car design.

Being a recording artist/songwriter/musician/entertainer is far more rewarding to me than any other profession. But I do believe that too much of anything is not good. I try to find a balance between being a full-time musician and songwriter by continuing my classic car business, because I truly believe that even if you're in paradise, you will eventually get sick of it. My long-term dream is to be a full-time touring musician and to perform all around the world, and hopefully buy a few classic cars along the way.

Other hobbies

I am a golf fanatic! I've been playing golf since age 12. Being a 4 handicap, I consider myself pretty good at it, but as many golfers know, we're always searching for the perfect swing which



Ask the Expert

"A friend recently shared a bottle of bubbly "pét-nat" and it was delicious. How is this wine different from Champagne or traditional sparkling wines?"

Crazy For Pét-Nat

Pét-nat is the easiest method to get bubbles into a wine, as you simply leave a little residual (unfermented) sugar in the wine and bottle it. This was the first way that sparkling wine was produced by accident hundreds of years ago, earning it the name Méthode Ancestrale. In contrast, Champagne, formerly called Méthode Champenoise (a term since banned by the European Union), is now primarily known as Méthode Traditionelle or the "traditional method." In this method you ferment the wine first to dry, then filter and stabilize the wine so it doesn't get cloudy when it gets cold, then add a touch of sugar and yeast once you bottle it to create the bubbles as it ferments in the bottle. Then the sediment from this is removed leaving you with a super clean, clear wine.

Natural wines are the rage with wine geeks these days, which basically means the wines are much more rustic, less finesse, and you can expect some funky, yeasty, and often cloudy wines as a result. Don't filter your wine, and then make sure it has a little unfermented sugar left once you bottle it, and boom, you have a very unpredictable, wild version of a spritzy wine with a little but a lot less bubbles than traditional Champagne or sparking wines.

One tip is to chill the bottle upright if you'd like to control the sediment in a hazy unfiltered natural wine. The cold keeps sediment at the bottom, allowing you to pour four relatively clear glasses of wine. The remainder in the bottle contains most of

the yeast, which can be enjoyed too if you like a few ounces of a cloudy yeasty unrefined wine. Not my thing for sure. It's easy for wineries to make this, they don't need any special equipment compared to when making traditional method sparklers, but the results are wide ranging and pretty unpredictable.

David is an instructor for North Seattle College, and serves as judge for various wine competitions including <u>The Wine Panel</u>, <u>Sip Magazine's Best of the NW</u>, and the <u>Seattle Wine Awards</u>. Mr. LeClaire is also a free-lance writer for the <u>Washington Tasting Room Magazine</u>.

He was also the founder of Wine World & Spirits, which at its' inception was the largest independent wine store in the Northwest, and was awarded the "2013 Independent Retailer of the Year" award by the Washington Wine Commission. David LeClaire previously served as wine director at Seattle's prestigious Alexis Hotel (& Painted Table Restaurant) for ten years.




