

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The First Families of Louisiana

Editor's Note: This information was published in Volume XI Number 1 of the DSGQ dated February 1974. It has been added here as it was originally submitted.

The First Families of Louisiana

Previous to the founding of New Orleans and the establishment of the Church there, records of marriages and baptisms were kept by the priests of Mobile. These early records, from the year 1704 through the year 1721, constitute the basis of genealogical research on the French pioneer families of this area.

Copies of these records, made with the permission of the Catholic Diocese of Mobile, by Alice D. Forsyth of New Orleans and Winston Deville, are deposited in the Special Collections Department of the Mobile Public Library and, as such, are in the public domain.

From these records the following list of married couples and their children, born before 1722, has been prepared.

With the founding of New Orleans, a number of these families removed to New Orleans. The Chenets, the Chauvins, the Mandevilles, the Rivards, the Trepagniers, and the Sauciers, became the wealthiest and most powerful families in early Louisiana. A number of their descendants are living in Mobile today.

Included in these records are marriages of widows and children of their second and third marriages. The children of early French marriages before 1722 are, of course, the first native-born inhabitants of Louisiana.

Mobile Family from Malaga

A MOBILE FAMILY FROM MALAGA

To many Mobilians the name "Alba" means a city street – a fishing and hunting club on a nearby river – a school in a neighboring town. There are a few who remember Captain Peter Alba, that picturesque philanthropist, who gave name to these places. A mere handful may know of the noble birth and ancient lineage back of that Spanish name.

Although Peter F. Alba was a native of Pensacola, Fla., having been born there February 13, 1833, he came to Mobile in his youth, died here in 1915, and is buried in Magnolia Cemetery, after a life so filled with drama it would fill a book.

The grandfather of Peter Alba, Don Pedro de Alba y Lopez immigrated from Spain and settled in Pensacola (then in the hands of Spain) towards the end of the 18th century. He was a native of Velez, Malaga of the Kingdom of Granada, born there in 1762, son of Don Pedro de Alba and Dona Monica Lopez, his wife. They had been married there 17 May 1754.

In the St. Louis Cathedral, New Orleans Register, dated 10 August 1784 there is given the marriage of Pedro de Alba, son of Pedro de Alba and Monica Lopez, natives of Velez, Malaga, in Granada, Provincia of Andalucia to Ysabel Rocheblave daughter of Pedro Pabla Rocheblave and Ysabel Gado of New Orleans. Pedro de Alba's will verifies this, but gives her complete name as "Isabel Adelaide Rastel de Pocheblave" and her mother's name as Isabel Godeau.

The Rocheblave family was of ancient and noble origin also, traced back to 1267 by D'Hozier, however it is the Alba line in which we are now interested. Celia Wyrover Robinson in her "Fabulous Families of Old Pensacola" says "The Alba family traces its decent from Spanish and Scotch houses with the Duke of Alba as an ancestor." Be that as it may, the genealogical records are well attested as far back as 1572.

Genealogy of Don Pedro de Alba y Lopez:

On the paternal side: grandson of Don Juan de Alba Gutierrez born 26 Dec. 1682, married 3 Aug. 1705 to Dona Augustina Ximemes, who was the daughter of Pedro Ximemes and Juana Gonzalez. The Comptroller of Makaga gave certificate of Nobility of the Kingdom to Don Juan de Alba Gurierres declaring that he (Don Juan) had served since the 20th of August 1706 among the other 600 Nobility of the Kingdom of Granada for the defence and guarding of its coast from the British.

Second grandson of Don Alonso de Alba and Dona Maria Manuela Gutierrez, daughter of Sebastian Gutierrez and Dona Antonia Guevarra. Don Alonso de Alba was Ensign of the Spanish Infantry for the defense of this coast, and afterwards Alcalde (mayor) of the Noble State in the City of Benamocarra.

Third grandson of Don Alonso de Alba and Maria de la Paz his wife, who were married at Velez 11 December 1638.

Fourth grandson of Don Fernando Sanchez and Elena de Alba, his wife. Her parents were Don Alonso de Alba and Dona Juana Martin, all natives and citizens of Velez Malaga.

Alonso de Alba, son of Francisco Carvonera and Marie de Alba, his wife, citizens of Nova de Medina, married in Velez 11 June 1584 to Francisca (?Juana) Martin, daughter of Juan Alonso and Maria de Rueda, citizens of Velez.

Genealogy of "Lopez", the maternal side:

Grandson of Jose Lopez Borja and Ana Lopez, his wife, citizens of Arenas de Doymalos.

Second grandson of Diego Lopez Rincon and Isabel Martin Cortes, his wife.

Third grandson of Cristoval Ruis Borja, and his wife Dena Antonia Gutierrez;

Fourth grandson of Diego Lopez Borja and his wife, Maria Ruis y Ruis, natives and citizens of Arenas de Doymalos.

Reference is made to the "Genealogical Tree of the Lopez Parejas, of the Sanche, of Mendosa Cortes, and other families" in which it is shown their descent from the first residents. In 1572 after the rebellion of the Moriscos, their haciendas and houses were confiscated and given to ancient Christians, who had not been native to the Kingdom of Granada. At this time a Census was taken. Among the forty citizens to inhabit the city of Arenas was Sebastian Lopez, citizen of Chincon, one grant; and his wife Luisa Lopez, who was of Cristovel Munoz, citizen of Santiago, one grant. These citizens were reported as "very distinguished and highly esteemed."

The above was summed up, under oath before notaries, by several witnesses of high rank: that both my maternal as well as paternal lines "their ancestors are and have been Nobles of an illustrious stock, very much esteemed in the cities of their birth"..."ancient Christians, free from all evil repute, of Moors, Moriscos, Mulattos, Jews and those newly converted to our Holy Catholic Faith, who have not been penanced by the Holy Tribunal of the Inquisition...because they have always comported themselves with the honor and estimation of their illustrious birth", etc.
