Join Families In Power!



Parents benefit from this leadership role by gaining confidence, skills, and connections, while children experience improved learning and development both at school and home.

Program staff also benefit from understanding the strengths, interests, and needs of the children, families, and community they serve.

Families in Power is a group of parents and community members in Head Start programs who help lead and make decisions about the program. Members are elected by parents of enrolled children and can serve for up to five years. Families in Power plays a vital role in providing overall direction for the program, and through it, parents have a voice in decisions regarding budget allocation, classroom activities, and community partnerships. Families in Power is a key component in our program, reflecting Head Start founders' belief in parents as essential partners in their children's education.

When is Families in Power? How do I get involved?

Policy Council meets in the Meadow Lane conference room on the 4th Tuesday of each month. Your Family Advocate will guide you through joining a meeting and what to expect! Does Families in Power provide childcare? Can my child join me? Head Start offers a classroom with adult supervision during Families in Power meetings! Am I committed once I join? What will happen if I miss a meeting? We understand that sometimes its not always possible to make the meetings. Join us when you can, if you like it, come again! Children & Households (REACH), provides access to affordable childcare, dedicated family support, community resources and health/wellness partners.

For eligible children and families, REACH provides:

- Free full-day childcare and transportation
- Dedicated advocates who work with families to identify needs and accomplish goals
- Access to additional community resources
- Financial assistance for transportation and fees for obtaining IDs and other documentation




Supermarket employees play a valuable role in educating and shaping the minds of children, and their influence goes beyond the traditional shopping experience.

Interacting with supermarket employees can help children develop social skills such as greeting others, asking questions politely, and following instructions. Employees can model appropriate behavior and




encourage friendly interactions.
