We pledge the concept of Masonic harmony in all that we do. Harmony is nothing more than working together and making the best decisions as a group. Then why is dissent, backstabbing and tension even present in any masonic organizations? Because it is not appropriately managed. Conflict can lead to a place where people feel free to disagree with each other and lobby for different ideas, often resulting in the best courses of action and concepts. If you are unwilling to participate in organizational conflict, you will never accomplish anything that are important to you and the organization. Inside the walls of the lodge there is no neighborhood boss. All members are equal and have a say in how things are to be accomplished.

Clarity is a positive outcome of managed conflict. Contention is built in the darkness. When members stay silent in meeting for the hope of reducing conflict, contention and resentment builds outside of the lodge and is then brought in. Nothing says you should always agree with your brothers, masonic harmony is the process of coming to an agreement and getting the actual work done. As masons, we do not need to avoid conflict but that we should use our tools to come to a harmonious conclusion or resolution of the conflict or disagreement. Once the decision is made by the body as a whole the conflict should end.

There is a stark difference between dissent and disagreement. Disagreement unto itself produces debate and new ideas, but dissent produces animosity. People who disagree have a basis to start an adult discussion. A free society thrives on disagreement as disagreement is the lifeblood of growth. Dissension on the other hand is a cancer. People who disagree only are seeking solutions to common problems and people who create dissent are only seeking power for themselves.

In Stated Meetings there seems to be the feeling that to have harmony prevail, especially when there is a motion on the floor, one should go along with the prevailing attitude; that to go against the motion and speak up is causing trouble-
