"Do Good, Leave the World a Slightly Better Place." -Susan Rossman.

Dear Friends,

The title of this monthly message came from Susan Rossman's eulogy. She concluded her eulogy by saying, "Do good, leave the world a slightly better place." That was her mantra, her sacred words that motivated her in life. She truly inspired so many of us by the way she

lived and by the way she passed to Olam Haba.

There are many lessons to be learned from Susan's life, and I am honored to share them with you. Three years ago, Susan joined our congregation after relocating from NYC. At the time, we didn't realize what a brave and fearless person Susan was. She faced her medical condition with such bravery that she inspired all of us. She refused to yield to feelings of victimhood and taught us wonderful lessons. Susan coped with her medical challenges in a heroic and admirable way. She was not bitter and always counted her blessings, namely her family and friends.

Lesson Number One- Each one of us can be a hero. Our behavior and how we cope with crises make ordinary people into heroes.

Susan came to the Temple three years ago and immediately joined our congregation and became one of its most active members. She became a Board member and chaired the Seniors By the Sea Mitzvah Program. She was Co-Vice President of Sisterhood and assisted with our kiddush luncheons. Susan loved our Temple, and we loved her in return.

We can't forget that on Yom Kippur, when Susan was extremely frail, she made extraordinary efforts to attend our Yizkor service and inspired all of us by that.

Lesson Number Two- Be involved! We learn from Susan not to ask what Temple Emanu-El can do for us but what we can do for our beloved Temple.

Susan was extremely generous, and we appreciate all she has done for us.

She didn't want recognition, and so we imprinted her generosity on our hearts.

Lesson Number Three- Be modest and humble, and if you do a mitzvah, do it for the sake of Heaven. Susan was a *Yekke*, which means she had a Jewish-German education and upbringing. *Yekke* implies someone highly organized, never late, and always functioning like a Swiss watch.

With that in mind, she planned her funeral to the last detail, including her eulogy. I am sharing only the parts related to our Temple with you.

Here is what she wrote in her own words:

"Susan almost felt as if her life began when she moved to Myrtle Beach. Yes, she had Scott and Dana, but they are young and needed to have their own lives. The third week after she arrived, she came to Temple Emanu-El. The first week there, she encountered a small-in-size dynamo, who said in a firm Brooklyn accent [Roz Weinerman], 'Where ya from? You'll stay for Kiddush!'

"Susan explained she was going to see her son. The next week Susan returned, and this time the tyrant did not accept Susan's firm "no," and she hog-tied Susan and said, "You'll take a plate for your son." So, Susan had no choice but to follow those instructions. (By the way, she loves this dynamo and is grateful for every minute of their friendship.) The third week Susan joined the congregation and felt she found a home. Little did she expect to find a family and hot-and-cold running friends. The people she met were not just acquaintances, but real and true friends. She joined the congregation and became integrated in this wonderful community. Starting with Mark, one of the finest men she had ever met; a man who would put his life down for any of the congregants. She felt lucky to call him a friend. When she started coming Friday nights, she met Carol Seplow and Vita Friedman. Vita is her bossy friend who saved her life by taking her to Urgent Care. But everyone who cared for Susan knows this story. Just know that Susan could not express her gratitude for their friendship and love. Such luck to have been allowed into their circle.

"This eulogy would go on forever if everyone who touched Susan's life and made it so fulfilled were mentioned; just suffice it to say, Susan's heart was full of love for these people.

"And then there is Amy Alese, who also became a friend and did so much behind-the-scenes work for Susan to look smarter than she was. (Think Grant.) Thank you, Amy, for your dedication. And then, of course, there is Rabbi Avi, the first rabbi Susan did not complain about his sermons. So who knew that she would find the perfect Rabbi and Rebbitzen? - A shock, but such is life. As we say during the announcements, 'Thank you to our awesome Rabbi Avi Perets.'

"And Susan's final words are 'Do good, leave the world a slightly better place' Thank you, my dear friends and family."

Lesson Number Four– Hospitality and friendship make a tremendous impact on the lives of our new-comers. A cheerful smile and encouraging words make a big difference, especially when someone is new to the area.

The loss of Susan leaves us sad, for we will miss her, but we are grateful for the beautiful memory that she leaves behind.

Zichrona livrachah - "Her memory will continue with us as an everlasting blessing." Amen.
