A Few Words After the High Holidays 5785

Dear Friends,

The High Holidays services were unique this year. They were influenced by the yearlong war in Israel and its global impact on Jews everywhere, as well as the tremendous increase in anti-Semitism in America and around the world. I tried via my sermons to convey the messages of unity of *Am Yisrael* and the need of every one of us to support Israel and the Jewish cause at this crucial time, even more than any other year. On Yom Kippur, I concluded my sermons with a positive, hopeful, and optimistic note for a better year and a better future for our people.

If the state of our congregation indicates the level of commitment to Judaism in the Grand Strand, I must conclude that we are in a good place.

First, our Temple Sanctuary during the High Holidays was packed to capacity with at least 200 people.

Second, many of you chanted the Torah readings and the Haftarot beautifully for the first time in your lives, and that was impressive and heartwarming to witness.

Third, we had two new Shofar blowers who practiced for months in advance for the *Yamim Noraim*, and they performed well.

Fourth, we were blessed to have two amazing teenagers chanting the Yom Kippur Haftarah flawlessly.

The services were spiritual, meaningful, and well organized, and I would like to take a moment to thank countless people who helped in the preparation of these magnificent days. How does he define separating from the people? Someone who doesn't identify with the *tzarah*, with the crisis and tragedy Jews are enduring, has no portion in the World to Come.

My wish for the New Year is that our vibrant and involved community continues on this path.




