Happy New Year 2025

Dear Friends,

Our Hanukkah dinner was a great success, and the Brothers of Temple Emanu-El have proved again that they can cook a sumptuous meal. It was one of the biggest crowds we ever had, 100 people!!! The children's talent show was a great hit, and I enjoyed seeing all of you marvel while the wonderful young performers of our Temple sang and played their musical instrument of choice.

By the time you receive this Bulletin, we will have changed the clock for another new and successful year in our Temple life. Year 2024 was a year of growth (Sixteen new families joined our Temple). Before we can move on and welcome the New Year, we must remember our country's most significant event in 2024: The United States' historic presidential election. This event caused a great division among our citizens. The long process of nomination by each party and then the debates between Donald Trump and Kamala Harris were characterized by many as the most controversial in recent history. The negative language of the campaigns, the mutual smear tactics, and the daily accusations created a hostile atmosphere in our country. People may say that this is the price we pay for a democracy, and we have to accept it. I'm afraid I have to disagree with this statement. We can do better!

I think that we lose our dignity and respect as a nation when we poison the public conversation. America was created on Judeo-Christian foundations, namely biblical foundations.

The values we cherish as a nation include the Golden Rule, the Ten Commandments, and a combination of biblical and modern democratic values of Liberty, Equality, and

Justice.

Now that the election process is over, it is time for healing and acceptance. You may not like or agree with our president-elect, Trump, but one must accept the democratic will of the American people. Now it is time to heal the division, and the Torah also hints toward that direction. The Midrash on the creation of the world finds an interesting point.

On five of the six days of creation, the Torah states, "GOD saw what He created and it was good." The one exception was the second day, when GOD created the "Rakia" (firmament) to separate the waters above from the waters beneath. Why was the creation of the second day different?

Our sages explain that on that day GOD created "division" (the firmament to separate...). Although it was necessary for the existence of the universe, this teaches us that division cannot be labeled as good!

Now it is time for unity!

May the New Year 2025 usher in an era of peace-peace in our homes, peace in our schools, peace in Israel, and peace for the entire world.
