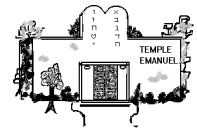

Do We Still Need to Commemorate Tisha B'Av Today?

Dear Friends,

This year, we observe Tisha B'Av on July 23 with fasting and prayer. Many people ask whether we still need to commemorate this day and what significance it holds in the 21st century. To answer that question, we must first reflect on the events that gave rise to this solemn fast day.

On the ninth and tenth days of the month of Av in the year 70 CE, after a four-month siege, Roman forces stormed Jerusalem and crushed the Jewish revolt that had begun in 66 CE. The revolt erupted during a period of political unrest fueled by the greed and incompetence of Roman officials as well as the zealotry of Jewish extremists.

The consequences were catastrophic. According to the historian Josephus, more than one million Jews perished, and nearly 100,000 were taken into slavery. The Holy Temple—one of the most magnificent structures in the Roman Empire—was destroyed, and Jerusalem was left in ruins. Jewish autonomy, which had existed with only brief interruptions since 539 BCE, came to an end under Roman rule.

The First Temple, built by King Solomon, stood for 410 years before being destroyed by Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, on the 9th of Av. The Second Temple stood for 420 years before it, too, was destroyed on the same date centuries later.

Our sages drew a profound distinction between the causes of these two destructions. The First Temple, they taught, was destroyed because of idolatry and other grave sins. Yet after seventy years, the Jewish people repented, and God allowed them to rebuild.

The Second Temple, however, was destroyed because of *SinatChinam*—baseless hatred among Jews. More than two thousand years later, it has still not been rebuilt.

This powerful teaching reminds us how essential **Ahavat Yisrael**—love and unity among the Jewish people—is to our survival and spiritual destiny.

Tisha B'Av is the saddest day of the Jewish calendar. Like Yom Kippur, it is a complete fast day, during which we refrain from food, drink, bathing, leather shoes, marital relations, and physical comforts. Yet, unlike Yom Kippur, Tisha B'Av is not a joyous holy day. Jewish tradition sometimes refers to Yom Kippur as the “white fast” and Tisha B'Av as the “black fast.” On Yom Kippur, when we seek forgiveness and purification, fasting elevates us

spiritually. But on Tisha B'Av, when we mourn the tragedies of Jewish history, the fast expresses heartbreak and loss.

According to Jewish tradition, the roots of Tisha B'Av go back even further—to the moment when the Israelites wept after hearing the negative report of the spies sent to the Land of Israel. Their despair and lack of faith marked the beginning of a tragic pattern in Jewish history.

Today, many ask: Do we still need a day of mourning now that we have the State of Israel?

The prophet Zechariah teaches that one day the fasts of mourning will become festivals of joy and gladness. Yet the rabbis explained that this prophecy will only be fulfilled when the world is truly at peace. Sadly, both Israel and the Jewish people continue to face war, terrorism, anti-Semitism, and division. The pain of Jewish history is not merely ancient history—it still echoes in our own generation.

Therefore, Jewish tradition, including the Conservative Movement, continues to affirm the importance of observing Tisha B'Av.

We need moments in life when we acknowledge sadness honestly and deeply. Only by walking through the valley of grief can we truly appreciate joy, healing, and hope.

I believe there is still great meaning in observing Tisha B'Av. By remembering the tragedies of our past, we strengthen our responsibility to build a future rooted in unity, compassion, and faith.
