The Lesson of Tisha B'Av

Dear Friends,

When we think about our Jewish holidays, we usually associate them with special prayers, good food, joy, and happiness; however, there is one holiday that has a different mood, and this is Tisha B'Av. This major fast day comes every year in the middle of the summer when many of our members are taking their vacations, and naturally, our synagogue activities are minimal. But Tisha B'Av is an important holiday and we should not undermine its place.

Only Tisha B'Av and Yom Kippur are considered major fast days, and this year, the fast starts on Monday evening, August 12, and lasts for 24 hours. On Tisha B'Av, we are prohibited from eating, drinking, engaging in sexual relations, bathing (except for minimal washing of the hands), and wearing leather shoes.

On Tisha B'Av (the ninth of the Hebrew month of Av), we commemorate the destruction of both temples. The First Temple (which King Solomon had built) and the Second Temple (which the returning exiles from Babylon had rebuilt) were destroyed on this same date but hundreds of years apart. The Temples were more than a place of prayers and sacrifices. They were the focus of national, spiritual, and political life in the Jewish State. The first one fell in 586 B.C.E., and the second one in 70 C.E.

Although both Temples were destroyed on the 9th of Av (about 600 years apart), our sages draw an important distinction between the sins that caused the destruction of the first and second temples.

Our sages tell us that the First Temple was destroyed due to the sin of idol worship. The sin that caused the destruction of the Second Temple was "Sinat Chinam" - "unjust hatred" among Jews.

The sin of idol worship is one of the gravest sins in the Torah. Indeed, the second commandment of the Ten Commandments is the prohibition against idol worship. Yet, only seventy years after the first Temple was destroyed, G-d forgave them for this sin, and they rebuilt the Temple.

But the Second Temple, which was destroyed for the sin of hatred among Jews, has not yet been rebuilt after two thousand years! This dramatically shows us how important the mitzvah is and how grave the lack of "Ahavat Yisrael"—love—amongst our people is.

Thus, during the days before Tisha B'Av, it is customary to enhance our love for each other ("Ahavat Yisrael") through acts of kindness and the distribution of extra charity.




