Hebrew Crash Course and Eliezer Ben-Yehuda

Dear Friends,

We recently concluded another successful program at Temple Emanu-El, the Beginners Hebrew Crash Course. I must admit that I was a bit surprised by the incredible enthusiasm that so many individuals expressed in this adult education class. It was heartwarming to witness many of you preparing and studying for these lessons. My first statement in the class was that Hebrew is a *Leshon Kodesh*, a holy language, and, therefore, particularly for Jews, it's a Mitzvah to learn Hebrew. We have witnessed many miracles in our lifetime, including the establishment of the State of Israel after the Holocaust, the exceptional resurgence of Judaism, and many other incredible achievements. One notable miracle is the revival of the Hebrew language in the 20th century after thousands of years when Hebrew was unspoken and unused in daily writing other than prayers. Today, millions of people around the world and Israel use Hebrew on a daily basis.

I highly recommend that you continue learning Hebrew via language courses online or with a teacher. Reading and speaking in the same language our ancestors spoke thousands of years ago is so fulfilling. Our entire Hebrew class can be found on WhatsApp, and we will happily assist you with this holy task.

To read more about the revival of the Hebrew language, please read the book Fulfillment of Prophecy, by Eliezer Ben-Yehuda—the man who revived the Hebrew language in Eretz Yisrael 130 years ago.

Ben-Yehuda not only revived the language but also significantly contributed to establishing the State of Israel. His grandson, Rabbi Eliezer Ben-Yehuda, who resides in Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida, wrote this excellent book about his grandfather's life and mission. Eliezer Ben-Yehuda was born in January 1858 in Luzhky, Lithuania. He contracted tuberculosis in the winter of 1878, and his doctors forecasted his demise within a year.

He described this vision:

"A clear, incandescent light flashed before my eyes

And a mighty inner voice sounded in my ears:

'the resurrection of Israel on its ancestral soil.'"

In 1881, Ben-Yehuda left for Jerusalem to dedicate his remaining days to fulfilling his vision. He passed away in 1922 in Jerusalem.

Here is another fascinating paragraph from the book Fulfillment of Prophecy, which took place in a

hospital in Algiers in 1879:

"At that time, the Hebrew spoken in synagogues around the world was not one but two tongues: the East European Jews spoke an "Ashkenazic" dialect, and the "Oriental" Jews, those who lived in Muslim countries since before the rise of Islam in the seventh century, spoke a "Sephardic" dialect. There were some fundamental differences between the two, particularly in the matter of the pronunciations of the last letter of the Hebrew alphabet, which the Ashkenazic pronounced "Sov" while the Sephardic pronounced it "Tav," and two vowels, one of which was pronounced "aw" and the other "ey" in the Ashkenazic, and "ah" and "eh" in the Sephardic. One might think that these are minor differences, unworthy of consideration—but, in fact, they make the Ashkenazic dialect unintelligible to a Sephardic Jew and vice versa. Since Eliezer came from Lithuania, it is only natural that he was versed in the Ashkenazic pronunciation; in fact, he did not know of the existence of the other until he came face to face with it when he was at the sanatorium hospital for tubercular patients in Algiers. While the medical staff at the hospital spoke French, the patient in the bed next to him, who was a "local," spoke nothing but the Arabic of his country and "Leshon ha'kodesh" - the holy tongue—Hebrew. Eliezer tried to converse with him in Hebrew—and found out to his horror that the man could not understand him, nor could he understand the man! Yet they were both speaking the same tongue! Eliezer took out his prayer book and pointed to a prayer: "Shma Yisrael," Hear, oh Israel. He asked the man to read it to him. Again and again, he listened to the man until he recognized the changes he had to make in his speech in order to converse with his fellow Jew in their ancient mother tongue. After a few days, he mastered the Sephardic pronunciation and could converse freely with his new friend. And he made a discovery in the process: Sephardic Hebrew is much more flowing, much more natural to the lips, and easier on the ears! He concluded to himself that this must be the true ancient Hebrew pronunciation and that the Ashkenazic is, in fact, corrupt. However, he didn't want to act in haste. He would put the two dialects to an impartial test."

If you wish to learn more about Ben Yehudah and his mission to establish Hebrew as the official language of Israel, please read this book. I know that you will find it an essential and inspiring historical document, a must for every proud Jew.




