



BECOMING A REGIONAL TRAINING DAY HOST CHURCH

THE REGIONAL TRAINING MODEL

Our hope is to release a wave of people within ministries that are equipped and confident to be first responders to youth in crisis. Therefore our training model is aimed as wide as possible. We work with local churches in different geographical areas to provide a training location that multiple churches and organizations are able to access. We deliver a full day training event that covers the fundamentals of our Youth Crisis First Responder training.

Host churches receive a discount on the overall training cost for their teams.

HOST CHURCH CRITERIA

We are so thankful when churches open up their spaces for us to build people up for this important ministry! We are looking for locations that are able to:

- Provide a meeting space for up to 80 people.
- Be equipped to project the training presentation and provide basic voice amplification.
- Have space to set up a refreshment table.
- Able to receive training resources that would be mailed to your church in advance.
- A willingness to publicise this event through your local contacts and networks.
- A willingness to coordinate the event so that we are able to travel to other cities in your state during the same timeframe.

THE COST

The regional training model is deliberately set up to spread the cost of bringing two trainers (a youth ministry veteran and a licensed therapist) to your region. In order to keep costs down we are looking for churches that allow us to use their space in return for a reduced ticket price for their ministry team. While we do not expect this, some churches have additionally offered to cover the cost of travel or take an offering to support the ongoing ministry of Youth Crisis First Responders.

Please note, that this is not an expectation of a church that is going to host a regional training day.
