Activities



Governance & Management

Wellington Manor is self-governed. Our five-member Board of Trustees is comprised of and elected by residents to two-year terms with a maximum of two terms.

There are many exciting ways to become involved in the Wellington Manor community. The work of the Board for the community is supported and enhanced by the volunteer work of our residents on committees including: Communications, Finance, Grounds, Recreation, Social, Sunshine, and Welcome.

Financial Overview

Wellington Manor is a fiscally sound community per our 2018 audit. There have been no deficits in operating budgets in more than a decade and HOA fees have remained stable since 2015. HOA fees, paid quarterly, cover operating costs including common landscaping, snow removal, pool maintenance, and non-operating costs. Our reserves (funds set aside) are currently funded at 90% of what is projected will be needed to replace and repair aging equipment.
