Northville Civic Concern (Phone: 248-344-1033) is located at 43275 W. Seven Mile, in the Highland Lakes Shopping Center. They accept unopened and non-expired food, personal hygiene products, and paper products at their office on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM. There is also a drop box in our Clubhouse.

The Presbyterian Thrift Shop (Phone: 734-459-1250) is located at 331 N. Main Street in Plymouth. They will take usable household items and adult clothing (in current styles) that they sell in their shop, and the profits support many local community charities. The hours are Tuesday and Thursday, 10:00 AM-2:00 PM; Wednesday, 6:00-8:00 PM (March through December); and Saturday, 10:00 AM-3:00 PM.

Northville's Annual Gigantic Garage Sale Fundraiser benefits the Northville Historical Society and the Dr. Karl Stockhausen Scholarship Fund. It is held at the Stockhausen family home, 218 W.
