A Message from Pastor Ken

This month I, myself, wanted to write for the Informer, as we enter the Season of Lent.

Lent is the forty days, not counting Sundays (Sundays are always little Easters, little feast days), before Easter, and traditionally is a time of re-evaluation, confession, re-commitment, cleansing, and discipline. It is a time to remind ourselves that life is short, and we want to make every minute count. It's a time to look at our lives and ask what is it that we want to change. It's a time to take stock. It is a time of spring-cleaning for the soul ("lent" is actually a Middle English word for spring).

Anyone remember the TV show "The Beverly Hillbillies?" Every spring, Granny would empty out the mansion and scrub the house from top to bottom. I remember my grandmother doing a version of that. Perhaps it was a way of casting out all the germs that had accumulated over the winter.

The image of spring-cleaning also works well for our soul. How often do you really peek behind things to ask questions like ... Why did I say that? Why did I do that? Why do I feel this way? Why can't I let things go? Why don't I feel Christ nearer? Do I really value that over Jesus? How can I have a better attitude? How can I better represent Christ? Do I really want to be healed? Do I believe?

Forty days is enough time to change a habit, to adjust a way of thinking, or to heal a wound. So, to enact this change, what would I need to do for the next forty days? What would I need God to do? What would I do that would help God change me?

For some people, it's giving up something – something that is tempting, but not life giving.

For other people, it's adding something – something that fills a hungry space, which leaves less room for unhealthy things.

How about you? What would a soulful spring-cleaning look like for you?

Imagine the joy of coming to church Easter Sunday, singing the songs and feeling the joy that resurrection really has happened again, because it happened in you.


Worship Tip #2

You should be a South Carolina United Methodist to participate. Email your submission to jbrodie@umcsc.org with the subject line Testify book.


UMCOR SUNDAY - March 22, 2020
