Board News

We had a very productive Church Evaluation Day in June. We SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) evaluated every area of Community and the surrounding community to help us with our planning meeting coming up in August.

Board Members will have a much-needed retreat on July 12. Special speaker Jason Bunger will focus on Intimacy With God. Food, fun, and fellowship will make the day a break from the world and an opportunity to refresh and rejuvenate.

You may be wondering about the front lawn reseeding and regrading project. We are working with the company that has been hired and they are keeping an eye on the weather for the best time for this project to begin, probably September. We are looking into a sprinkler system to help with watering once our seeds are planted.

Another big project, replacing the original lights in our building with LEDs, is taking another step toward completion. A few years ago, our friend and electrician, Dave Rau, initiated this project by replacing the lights in the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen with LED lights. Since then, Active Electric has continued by replacing the lights in the hallways, several rooms on the main floor, and Lower Fellowship Hall. Now, Active Electric is coming back to replace the lights in the remaining rooms on the main floor (Women's Restroom, Nursery, Library, and offices), as well as replace the fans in the Women's Restroom. This will significantly improve our lighting and electric bills.

All these plans are in God's hands and your obedient contributions make it all possible. Thank you!

We will continue to have snacks/lunch in the Fellowship Hall after




service. The 1st Sunday is usually a lunch provided by Sally Borba and family. The 4th Sunday will be cupcakes to celebrate the month's birthdays.
