December 28 – The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

Dear Parishioners and friends,

As we enter the final weekend of December 2025 celebrating the feast of the Holy Family, it is essential to anchor all our faith in God as we prepare to enter 2026, and I trust that you will do exactly that. I encourage you. Moreover, I hope the year brings us closer and more united in the archdiocese as we wait for Archbishop Zinkula and his core team to finish working on the Journey in Faith pastorate models. What follows is a reflection on the feast of the Holy Family from Archbishop Zinkula, along with some upcoming events he invites you to be part of; so please save the dates.

As we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, the gospel reminds us that family life is never easy. Even the Lord's family had to endure hardship and exile at the very beginning. Because of the fear and wrath of Herod, the Holy Family was forced to make an arduous journey to Egypt. For months, and probably years, they were separated from familiar people and places.

Eventually, they returned to Nazareth. What was it like? How had things changed? Were they missed? Hopefully, the ties—especially among their family members—remained strong. One of the marks of a “holy” family is firm reliance on one another and confidence that even though circumstances may shift, love remains constant.

Who has been missing from your Sunday assembly at Mass? Have you reached out to this person or family? When you encounter fellow parishioners at worship or parish activities who may have been away for a while, what do you say? How do you offer welcome and hospitality? At times, we can presume that people who have drifted from parish life are lazy or angry. We can grow judgmental. But perhaps, like the Holy Family, they have faced hardship or have had to carry out their relationship with God elsewhere for various reasons. Members of holy families are resilient in their commitment to one another. By God's grace, may we be found as such.

I ask for your continued spiritual support and leadership in prayer. Please encourage your parishioners to join me for a special Novena from the Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus (January 3) through the Baptism of the Lord (January 11), asking the Holy Spirit to guide our discernment and renew our unity as one Church.
