



You picked the wrong January to stay in Iowa


When I checked my messages on Tuesday morning, a little after the weekday Masses were canceled, I caught sight of one from Barbara Morrissey "You picked the wrong January to stay in Iowa, this is not usual". I immediately responded with a laughing emoji to show my agreement to what she texted. The background to Barb's message is that in the past four years, I have always traveled back home in January, to be with my folks and to catch some warm weather before I returned to Iowa to do my ministry. It was always a good start to the year.

This year, I decided to change the formula not to go in January, but instead, go in the summer time to avoid going from extreme cold to extreme heat. A summer trip this year will offer me the occasion to visit the beneficiary communities of our Project of Hope (wells for Ghana), currently being constructed in the Central Region of Ghana (my home region).

Barb, I had no idea how cold it was going to be in Iowa this year but all the same, thanks for your prayers for me to survive the season! Every day of this wonderful season makes me imagine how the forefathers and mothers that settled here earlier survived without the heating systems which we have today. For my young nephews and nieces back in Ghana who wonder how cold it could get in Iowa, the closest analogy I offer for their understanding is the refrigerator or deep freezers. I tell them to project that cold to what the winters bring on this beautiful land.

All said and done, we are grateful to God that the worse is now behind us, by and large we can say to ourselves 'this too shall pass'!
