Journey in Faith - Part II

Embracing the Mission and Vision of the Archdiocese of Dubuque Dear Friends,

As we continue the *Journey in Faith* in the Archdiocese of Dubuque, we are called to embrace the mission and vision that guide our life as Church. Every successful organization is driven by a mission and vision. Mission defines the organization's purpose, while vision provides a roadmap for its future. Mission explains why we exist; vision inspires how we live that purpose out. Both are upheld by shared values, the foundational principles that give our faith community direction and strength.

Jesus gave the Church a universal mission: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). Empowered by the Holy Spirit through prayer, Sacraments, and Scripture, our archdiocesan mission is to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ, thereby transforming our community to become more like Him in thought, word, and deed.

Vision:

We are an engaged archdiocesan community of joyful missionary disciples, centered in our Eucharistic relationship with Jesus Christ and united through our legacy of faith.

These statements remind us that we are all called to proclaim the Gospel and serve others, just as Jesus did. In the past, parishes often acted independently, even competitively, based on ethnic or geographic identity. With more people and resources, that may have seemed sustainable. But today's reality demands a more collaborative approach.
