PASTOR SPEAKS

Journey in Faith as the Archdiocese of Dubuque

Dear Friends,

This past weekend, we received a letter from Archbishop Thomas Zinkula, inviting all the good people of the Archdiocese of Dubuque to join in finding innovative ways to engage in our common mission as missionary disciples of Christ in our parishes. Due to the significance of the message, I also requested that the letter be emailed to each of us so that we could read it, reflect on it, and share insights on how we can stay engaged together. If you were not in Church or haven't had the chance to read it, please try to make time for it.

The letter was issued following a three-day convocation of all priests in the archdiocese, working in various parishes and offices. The occasion provided us with a sense of what is generally happening in the different parishes and the Archdiocesan Church, as insights from the DMI survey and analyses revealed. Priests, both active and retired, also shared their experiences of what they have observed in the parishes and the archdiocese. The common mantra was that things have changed so much.

The clergy and laity of the archdiocese know that the Church we love, know, serve, and attend today is not the same one that formed us in yesteryears. We can find reasons for it; some may be internal, while others may be external.

Indeed, things have changed dramatically, and everything we hold dear in the Church has been affected—demographic shifts, declining vocations, membership, attendance, and participation in parishes—are no secret kept in the archives. But the reality that stands before us is that things will not suddenly turn around as we may hope. However, we can find ways to work through and survive, even thrive.

Indeed, the changing organizational landscape not only impacts the Catholic Church but also Christianity as a whole. Even secular organizations are facing their share of the cultural and social shifts. And yet, we know that all organizations seeking to continue their mission and remain relevant must adapt and innovate during challenging times to capitalize on the available opportunities.

Thus, from my humble point of view, the archbishop and all of us in the archdiocese are taking the proper steps to engage us in understanding our context and responding with a new effort in pastoral planning. As the archbishop has emphasized, the goal is not "about managing decline; it is about mobilizing mission. It's about building something sustainable, hopeful, and holy for the generations yet to come."

As has often happened, any process of innovation can be challenging and tedious. It requires discernment to arrive at something meaningful and sustainable. However, it also raises numerous questions, doubts, and uncertainties. Once again, as your pastor, I invite you to look to the future with hope and join the rowing team to cross the finish line together, where we can say together that we contributed to something sustainable in our parishes and the archdiocese.


