August 15— Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

As we prepare to celebrate the *Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary*, it is essential that we understand the basic and acceptable Catholic teachings, position, and attitude towards Mary, which simply put is that we honor Mary, we venerate her, we express our love for her, but we never worship her.

Mary herself tells us the reason in her own words in the "Magnificat" found in the gospel of Luke chapter 1:46-55: "All generations will call me blessed, because the Mighty One has done great things for me…"

Here are some of those great things we believe about Mary:

- 1. Jesus gave her to us as our Heavenly Mother while on the Cross: "Woman, behold your son" ... "Behold your mother" (John 19:26–27).
- **2.** Mary is the best model for us in holiness, obedience, and humility: "Full of grace" ... "Let it be done to me as you have said"... "Behold the handmaid of the Lord."
- 3. God chose Mary to be the mother of Jesus.
- 4. God filled her with the Holy Spirit—twice: at the Annunciation and at Pentecost.
- **5.** God made her "full of grace," the perfect example of all virtues. God allowed her to suffer with Jesus, not in body, but in mind and soul, as He suffered for us.

Why the doctrine of Assumption of Mary?

Pope Pius XII explained the reasons in the document *Munificentissimus Deus*, based on Sacred Tradition:

- 1. The early Christians believed in Mary's Assumption from the first century.
- 2. All the ancient liturgies of the Church spoke of it.
- 3. There is no tomb of Mary that is venerated—while most apostles have theirs.
- **4.** There are examples in the Old Testament of bodily assumption: Enoch, Elijah, and maybe even Moses.
- **5.** The human body decays because of original sin. But Mary was immaculately conceived, so her body was not touched by corruption.
- **6.** As the one who carried Jesus and cooperated fully in His mission, her place is with Him in Heaven, body and soul.

Life Messages from the Assumption

- 1. Mary's Assumption was a reward for her holy life. That's a call for us to live pure and holy lives too because as St. Paul suggests: our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit; our body parts are members of Christ's Body; our bodies will be glorified on the Last Day.
- 2. The Assumption gives us hope in our own resurrection. It encourages us in times of despair, pain, or temptation.

This feast is a message of complete freedom from everything that holds us down—impure thoughts, bad desires, harmful habits, addictions, unkindness, injustice, and sin.
