PASTOR SPEAKS

Journey in Faith – Part III Embracing the Mission and Vision of the Archdiocese of Dubuque

Dear Friends,

In last week's bulletin, just like the preceding week, I wrote about the Journey in Faith, which is a pastoral planning the archdiocese is seeking to undertake with the sole reason to do more than just revitalize the parishes within the archdiocese. I introduced to you the new mission and vision of the archdiocese that support the transformation of parishes and parishioners:

Mission: Empowered by the Holy Spirit through prayer, Sacraments, and Scripture, our archdiocesan mission is to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ, thereby transforming our community to become more like Him in thought, word, and deed.

Vision: We are an engaged archdiocesan community of joyful missionary disciples, centered in our Eucharistic relationship with Jesus Christ and united through our legacy of faith. This week, I continue with the topic, emphasizing the crucial role each of us plays in living out the Journey in Faith that the archdiocese is seeking to roll out. Our active participation is key to keeping our parishes engaged and flourishing. In other words, the archdiocese is counting on us. What does the archdiocese want from us? It wants our commitment and involvement.

It is simple. We are to be excited and prepared to embrace the new realities that we face. Once understood, being on a journey together will require us to be aware that what we are accustomed to or have been doing for some time can be done in other ways.

New realities connote a change, a change that brings with it opportunities for growth and renewal. Whether it's a change in our own situation or the situation around us, it's an opportunity to start thinking of doing something different. Even if things have not changed dramatically for us, but for others, it's an opportunity to do something different, to make a positive impact.

As Catholics, we are guided by the principles of authentic *worship*, *prayers*, *charity*, and *lifelong learning*. These are principles that drive our personal and collective lives.

The worship that directs our focus to the participation in the sacramental life of the Church, especially through the Eucharist and Reconciliation is something every Catholic values and should continue to value because it connects us to God and the Christian community. Charity, by which we respond to the needs of others and the church in imitation of Christ, is to be pursued too. Through prayer, we grow our relationship with God through personal conversion and lifelong learning by which we are open to the Holy Spirit to teach us new things. And we follow these principles because we understand that we are not complete. God is not done with us yet; so, we must continue to avail ourselves of the Holy Sprit's prompts.
