

Conversation with 'Altar Boys' on the call to priesthood

Occasionally, I will get into a brief conversation with the young boys who are scheduled to serve at the weekend liturgy about the priesthood. There are a few of them who will think aloud, O my gosh...that is not for me! For a few of them, this is not one of the things to consider for a career. Apparently, even when they think this way, I bet you, it's not yet over for God since he alone knows how to turn the human heart towards himself. So, the first thing I'd like to say here is that no male child should close the door of their hearts to the call of God to serve him as a priest. God may be knocking hard at a closed heart. very helpful to unlocking the heart.

The second thing that comes out from my encounter with altar servers has got to do with not being sure if God is actually calling. In other words, how sure could you be if God was calling? This is particularly interesting in the sense that sometimes it happens that 'we are trying to set out our own criteria and seem to be saying that I am not ready to check all the boxes now, so God please look elsewhere and leave me alone. God please I am not a super holy kid, I don't say my prayers, I don't read my Bible and I am sure God does not want someone like that.

nation ceremony and Chrism Mass) are The only thing about this way of thinking is that it leads to shutting the door to Jesus, and literally saying that 'hey you can do all that you want with me but please leave me out of this. So, here is how I guide them through our conversation. I say to them that God does not usually call special people; he calls ordinary people. He can call anybody to the priesthood. To anyone he calls he gives abundant grace to become a child of God and a disciple of Jesus. He sends them to go and serve others in his Church. Will you allow him to call you now?

Songs Come from Scriptures

Music has an amazing ability to speak to our hearts and minds like no other communication. Songs connect with our emotions and hearts. The language of the lyrics works its way into our souls and helps us express what's in our hearts. It is a glorious gift of God, and just like praying from Scripture, we can pray from liturgical songs.

The next time you're at Mass, listen carefully to one of the songs. songs that are chosen for Mass, whether by the choir on the weekend or by Father at daily Mass, are scripturally based, supporting the prescribed readings of the day. Because of this, you can allow the song to open your heart and mind to enter a conversation with God. Internalize the message of the song, God's message, and meditate on the meaning behind the words. Allow the words of the song to be your prayer. Sing them. Listen to them. Let the song permeate your heart.

Many of the songs we hear in church are based on prayer and Scripture, so try using just the lyrics for your prayer. Choose one of your favorite songs at Mass, and try not to sing along, simply read the words, taking time to consider what they mean. Too often, we sing along in church, not really thinking about the words. Slowing down and reading the words can bring a deeper

understanding to these beautiful hymns.

Every ministry in the church has a purpose, and the church choir is no exception. The three choirs of our cluster do an excellent job of picking music that truly "speaks" their prayer. Take time to thank these choir members, helping them realize how important their ministry is to each of our churches. You might even consider joining one of these choirs and its ministry. Remember, God gave you the voice, and He would love to have you give it back to Him in prayer and praise.

2020 Census - We Count!

Participating in the 2020 Census is a vital, civic duty for everyone living in our Diocese. We should encourage all parishioners to participate as an accurate count impacts federal representation and distribution of federal funding in our communities. Pastors/Parishes will receive bulletin announcements, brief public service announcements and flyers that can be inserted in bulletins and posted throughout the facilities. One set of resources will be provided for each weekend February 14/15 through March 14/15. Our goal is to ensure our parishioners know that:

- Everyone counts.
- Each household will receive a postcard beginning mid-March and can respond easily either online or by phone. This should take about 10 minutes and support for multiple languages is available.
- The questions asked are basic and there is good guidance available when needed.
- Confidentiality is guaranteed by law and personal information will not be shared with any other individual or agency. The Census Bureau is only

- allowed to use the information available to generate statistics.
- Counting children, a traditionally undercounted population, is important.

You can find additional resources and information at our diocesan census page. It is my hope some of you will offer access to parish or school computers a time or two along with volunteers to assist community members in completing their census survey. Thank you for supporting the 2020 Census.

World Day of Prayer


