

To Our Parishioners & Friends

8th Sunday in Ordinary Time-and The Start of Lent

During this 8th week in Ordinary Time, we will move to the season of holy Lent. The readings of the 8th Sunday are embedded with excellent, practical exhortations to assist our readiness for Lent.

Change leaders and motivation researchers believe that a person's potential to attain a desired future or goal lies in the ability to see that future and work towards it. Along these lines, the Book of Sirach points out our unique role in caring for and shaping our lives. It reminds us that it is only by conscious effort that we can make our life, both spiritual and physical be pleasing to God and others.

St. Paul takes the same transformative perspective and highlight's the future immortality and incorruptibility of Christians as a reason to fight for victory over sin and death. According to Paul, if we are to overcome evil, we need to stay grounded in Jesus Christ and practice his teachings.

The gospel story is about a personal blind spot. The danger of blind spot is that it creates a comfort zone for us, instead of a discomfort one. Blind spots express themselves in judging and condemning others when their actions and words fall below our ballpark estimation of them; also, it stops us from leaning towards life change.

The lesson from the gospel is one of personal care. We should not ignore the opportunities we have to seek the transformation of our lives. Making changes in the weak spots of our lives take time and effort, but it must be something we don't give up on or cease to advance in it.

Transitioning to Ash Wednesday:

As Lent commences this Wednesday, the church draws upon the words of scriptures to remind us to deepen our faith and relationship with God, with ourselves, and with others. What an excellent time to return to the Lord and renew our spirit (Parish theme for the year).

The renewal of our lives during these 40 days should be of interest and concern to us as Christians. One of the unique benefits of Lent is that the length of time it covers is enough to support any break with bad habits and inclinations or the cultivation of desired ones. Spending more time praying and reflecting, attending Mass, listening to the Lord in the Eucharist Adoration, reading the bible, and other spiritual writings can help us discover the personal cracks or bad habits and work to seal them or find a new passion or sweat spot to focus our attention.

Ash Wednesday readings will challenge us to gravitate to the Lord through repentance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Lent is the time to bring the hopes you entertain, the struggles you have against temptation, the sweat joys you experience when you taste the Eucharist, and the comfort you have in the fellowship of your family and friends to the Lord and the parish church community.

- We will have "Ash Friday" service Friday, March 4th with Stations of the Cross starting at 6:00pm with the service to follow.
