The Importance of Mass

During Lent, we are challenged to embrace the season's three "pillars": prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These three, taken together, support a strong Lenten journey. But why is prayer one of these pillars? Isn't prayer essential to our everyday spiritual lives? The answer is yes. It is a pillar to remind us that prayer is one of the most important things we do in our lives, if not the most important thing.

The Mass is the greatest prayer we can offer to God. It is a re-enactment of Christ's suffering and death and the chance to connect with the real presence of Christ's body and blood. Attending Mass inspires us to model our lives after Jesus and to discover our sense of purpose. It helps us see that we are here to serve and to love. It is what Christ called us to do and whom Christ made us to be – members of His body.

If we do not find much significance in

the Mass, it may be because our whole mind, heart, and soul are not there. The Mass is not like the movies, where we passively sit and watch; we are not an audience. We need to be active participants who make the liturgy happen. If we actively participate, we receive God in two ways: through His Word and through the Eucharist.

The Word of God is a tremendous gift, allowing us to hear God's voice and abide in His presence. The Scriptures are the word of God, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Through the readings God speaks to us personally, penetrating the depths of our hearts, nourishing us and challenging us to continuing conversion. They not only tells us of God and God's will for us, they also helps us to put that will of God into practice in our own lives.

However, the most intimate moment of the Mass happens when we receive our Lord in the Eucharist and come into communion with Him. This is the sign of our covenant with God, Jesus's body and blood, and we are to partake of it in memory of Him. In the Eucharist, Christ is truly present, just as when he walked the roads of Galilee, healing and preaching. When we receive the Eucharist at Mass, we are unifying ourselves to God and to the other members of the Church through the Body of Christ.

Without question, the Mass is the greatest prayer we have. Through it, we give thanks and praise to God for the wonderful future He has given us in His Son. We also ask forgiveness for our sins and beg the Father's blessing upon us. God's grace can only work in our lives if we are open to receiving it; we will only get out of this relationship with God what we put into it. This is why there is nothing more important than going to Mass.

What is Asked

From Bishop Zinkula: The 2020 Census gathers basic but important information about each household. For example, you will be asked the number of people at the address and whether any additional people live or stay there, so each person is counted once in the right place. The phone number you provide is only used if you must be contacted for official Census Bureau business. Names, birthdates, gender and race for each person are collected to ensure everyone is counted and to keep ancestry records. There is also a question whether or not a person is of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin, and these statistics are used by federal agencies to monitor compliance with antidiscrimination provisions. Remember, your responses are confidential and secure. They are also important because everyone counts!
