"We've never lived in a time like this. This is unprecedented, and things are getting worse!" Turn on any channel to Him (Romans 8:28). hear the news at night and this is what you hear. Yet we who are familiar with the Bible know that there have been times like this before. The Bible has many stories about pestilence, fears, and dark times, but these stories also remind us that even though these problems are great, God is greater.

This is a time to feed our faith. If we feed our faith, our fears will diminish. But we have to do intentional things to feed our faith. We need to open our hearts and our Bibles. God is faithful and He knows us. He formed us in our mother's womb (Psalm 139). He created us. He saved us, and He

called us. He knows how to work all things for the good of those who love

Jesus told us to love one another (John 13:34). So let's focus on random acts of kindness. Send a note to someone or pick up the phone and make a call. Let them know you care about them. The next time you're in the grocery store, thank the people working there for all they are doing to keep us supplied. our police force and firemen. These people are doing all they can to keep us safe.


