

We Are Never Alone

Sometimes it's hard to believe that just a year ago the world came to a screeching halt. We all hunkered down within our homes, fearful of the unknown. This was completely foreign to us because we were not meant to live life on our own. We were meant to be part of a family, and beyond that, we were meant to be part of a community. We don't flourish as people by being isolated and living by ourselves, but by engaging as full members of a community.

God created us social by nature, to desire union with others. We become better people when we learn to live with and love the people around us. When we learn to sacrifice for our family and for our friends, we become more human. As Catholics we are a community, a family with a story, a history, and a mission to share the joy of the gospel. We need to pray that God will grant us every grace needed during this time, and Mary, Mother of the Church and our Mother, will intercede with Her Son to be our strength and support as well.
