

PASTOR SPEAKS

Fostering a Missionary Discipleship Parish CULTURE

Part One

Are you a practicing missionary disciple?

Let us reflect on this question during the Easter Season.

"Then they went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed, and ran to announce this to his disciples." (Matt 28:8).

For over two thousand years, the joy of the gospel, which the women received from the angel and shared with the apostles "fills the hearts and lives of those who encounter Jesus" (Pope Francis, *Joy of the Gospel*).

After we have believed in the resurrection of Jesus and have been baptized into His death, we are called to live as missionary disciples in our parish community.

Living and practicing missionary discipleship stems from our baptism by which we are given our personal reasons to teach and announce the same gospel of joy we have received to others.

"All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization...The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized... to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are 'disciples' and 'missionaries,' but rather that we are always 'missionary disciples.' " (Pope Francis, *The Joy of the Gospel, 120*).

A 2017 document from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) , "Living as Missionary

Disciples", laid out four moments in the evangelization process:

Encounter. Encountering Christ is the purpose of evangelization.

Accompany. Encountering Christ with family and friends in the Church provides encouragement and support.

Community. Once we have joined with Christ, we join others in the Christian community to form a parish family.

Send. Filled with zeal, we become empowered to share our beliefs with others and bring them to believe with us. Missionary discipleship is an invitation to be actively engaged with your faith.
