PASTOR SPEAKS

As Celebrating Holy Week Together

Holy Week is Here: Beginning today, the Christian world enters a time of reflection and prayer to mark Palm Sunday and the start of Holy Week. Even more remarkable is the way our universal Catholic brothers and sisters will be celebrating the holy event. Catholics will gather in our local parish churches with palms in our hands to commemorate the awe-inspiring events of the Lord's final entry into Jerusalem and his passion and death that followed.

Personal Invitation to Come to Christ: I am personally inviting all individual parishioners and families within our parish to come to the Holy Week celebrations. Also, pray that the Lord instills in your heart somebody that he wants you to encourage and invite back to church as we celebrate this amazing time of God's welcoming and open love to us. It is this understanding that should fill our hearts with joyful anticipation as we look forward to our coming together as a church family to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of our Lord.

Witness of Self-giving Love: Last year as I visited the Holy Land, I had the opportunity to see all the sites that are featured in the gospel readings during this Holy Week. Observing these sites brings the heart of a responsive soul to a sober recognition that it was Christ's self-giving love that led to face such much fate.


From high mountains of Gethsemane to the deep Kidron Valleys, Christ made His passages willingly despite being forced and treated like a criminal; He subjected himself to all the difficulties for us. To the eyes that behold these sites which still bear the marks of the savior, it is a life-transforming moment and an open invitation to say, "Live Jesus, live forever in me!"

The Eucharist as Holy Week: As Christians, our perception of the reality Holy Week as the foundation for Holy Communion should continue to nudge us to run towards the Lord of the Eucharist. Whatever purpose for which Christ died, he expressed it in the Eucharist for us: "Do this in memory of me," (Luke 22:19). So, the celebration of the Eucharist as a reliving of the Paschal Mystery always needs to end in the reception of Holy Communion.

Christ gave Himself out of love for us so that we may reciprocate this love by honoring and receiving Him in Holy Communion. Thus, our faith does not hinge on the participation or encounter with the Mass but on the reception of him who comes to us in Holy Communion.

I hope to see you at Mass to celebrate and receive Holy Communion during Holy Week and Easter.
