SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Those who are unable to share in the Eucharist may make an act of spiritual communion, expressing their desire for the Sacrament.

As Pope St. John Paul II reminded us, using the words of St. Teresa of Jesus: "When you do not receive communion and you do attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you."

The following prayer, by St. Alphonsus Liguori, may be used to make an act of spiritual communion:

My Jesus.

I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament.

I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul.

Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.

As though You have already come,

I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You:

never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
