## **PASTOR SPEAKS**

### Feast of Pentecost: Guidance from the Holy Spirit

Happy Feast of Pentecost— it's the birthday of the Church! Do you feel you are a part of this momentous event? Yes, you are! You may not have lived in the first century or have been in the Upper Room with Peter and the rest of the apostles, but you are still an integral part of this rich experience of receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Let me share a story with you. A little black boy was out during a city carnival. As he moved around, he was attracted to a man who was filling the atmosphere with colorful balloons. He would blow air into the balloon, tie it and release it to fly. While captivated by the colors of balloons flying in the sky, the little boy noticed that there was no black balloon among what he saw flying. So he asked the man, who was flying them, "Sir, can black balloons fly too?" Just then, the man gave a gentle smile, and stepped back, looked through the balloons, picked a black one, filled it with air, and discharged it into the air. It didn't take long for the boy to see a black balloon in the air. Then the man came to the boy who was now smiling and said to him, "Son, black balloons could fly too; it's not what is outside but what is inside." It's the air inside that causes all balloons to fly regardless of the color.

Similarly, on the day of Pentecost, all the disciples gathered in the Upper Room received the Holy Spirit and individual gifts. All of us can be filled with the Holy Spirit and be filled again and again.

What is more, whether you are older or younger, cradle Catholic or new to the faith, the Holy Spirit can be present to you in ways you can't imagine. We have Him, but unless we follow his guidance, his leading, we won't experience his full presence and support for our lives.

As Christians, there are many situations we need guidance. We need to decide whether to be in a particular place, take a specific job, go to a particular school, do a specific program, do this or that for family and friends, etc.

In these and other scenarios, we need guidance, the little nudges or words of encouragement from the Holy Spirit to act well. The Holy Spirit can guide us towards the best actions.

How do I know that the Spirit is guiding me? 1. What the Spirit asks you to do *NEVER* ends in fear. 2. What the Spirit asks you to do *NEVER* keeps you in apprehension. 3. What the Spirit asks you to do, you will FEEL it in your soul that it is the right thing to do (Romans 8:14-16).

However, at the very least, we should **RECOGNIZE**, **RESPECT**, and **RESPOND** to the Holy Spirit to gain all these benefits for a happy, fulfilled life. Happy Pentecost!
