PASTOR SPEAKS

How to Last in your Christian Journey

Being a Christian is like running a marathon: how we start is necessary, but how we finish is even more crucial. One can not be a professional Christian, living and practicing the Christian faith and then retiring from it at some point and be done with it. Several lessons and illustrations can be drawn from the passages of the scriptures we read today to assist us to grasp the meaning of this idea of how to last in the Christian journey.

In the first reading the Lord spoke to Moses to announce to the people of Israel, "You have seen for yourselves how I treated the Egyptians...if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine. You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation." The passage indicates that the liberation of the people from Egypt was only a first step towards a calling for lasting relationship with God; the journey had just begun, but not completed.

Notice how God established the people of Israel as a holy community of priests. Notice again how membership was predicated on the people's hearing God's voice—their obedience to Him! In Christian theology this is the notion of the "common" priesthood of all the baptized. Just like the Israelites, our journey to be Christians and disciples of Christ is meant to last all of our lifetime. And it also calls for certain actions on our part. What are these actions? We shall discover them ahead.

In the gospel Jesus addresses His disciples about a major concern in His heart, the sustainability of the faith of Christians in these words, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." The abundance here refers to two simultaneous situations. The first is the people in the world who need to be reached with the Christian message. The second is how those who accept the good news and become Christians will last in their journey to the end. Both instances call for some actions.

Here are some of them: 1.Remember God's mercy and turn to it always; 2. Be truthful and honest in all you do towards God and others; 3. Be motivated to live for Jesus' sake, not out of selfish desires or motives to please human beings, 4. Don't forget every Christian is only human; 5. Develop sincere love for others; 6.Stay focused on the important things in life, including faith practices and not distracted by temporal and momentary concerns.

Living with these attitudes and behaviors can potentially humble us and lead us to keep running the marathon of life and faithfulness to the Lord Jesus Christ to the end. We belong to a kingdom of priests and holy people in the world.
