

Father Francis Lil'O Corner "Have Mercy On Us For We Have Sinned"

Our Lenten journey is rolling on, and just next week is our communal penance. Our chief shepherd, Bishop Thomas Zinkula comes among us to lead us to an experience of God's mercy and healing. We will call on God

to forgive our sins as individuals and as a community. We do so with the assurance that 'whoever calls on the name of the Lord will be saved'. So, why communal penance? Most of our Christian practices are embedded in Old Testament traditions. The people of Israel of old, were used to celebrating days of penance/ atonement. This was a gathering of the whole community, which offered them the opportunity to show sorrow for what they had done wrong as well as the good they had failed to do.

Communal penance offers us the moment of grace to look eye to eye with our brother or sister, friend or neighbor to say sorry and to heal together. That reminds me of one powerful image of reconciliation that my late pastor (home parish in Ghana) gave me. This was when a member of his church stood up during a communal penance celebration and pointed hands at a man in the church and exclaimed "Father, this man killed my husband and I forgive him". They each broke into tears. The man had been among the rebel fighters in Liberia during the war but had later abandoned it to take refuge in Ghana, only to meet the wife of one of the several people he killed. They wept together. This wife and mother wept her pain and unforgiveness away whiles this ex-rebel wept his way into healing and restoration.

What we intend to achieve with our communal penance is to celebrate God's mercy for our community. We want to show true contrition for our individual and community sins. We want to weep together for our sins of the past and present and to ask for God's grace to renounce our sins and avoid the near occasion of them.

Praised be Jesus Christ...Now and forever!



Be assured, we can stand on the Word of God because it is the only thing that does not change. Since the beginning of time, God's Word is unchanging and helps show us how to live in a world that constantly changes.

There are thousands of promises in the Bible and the bulletin cover list is just a small place to start. We hope you'll read them and remember these promises that continue through all time. Be grateful to God and ask for greater wisdom of these promises in your life. Write down comments that come to your mind of what God's promises mean

to you or read Scripture and find as many promises of God you can find in the Bible.

- Ezekiel 36:26-27: I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws.
- Romans 8:1-2: Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you^[a] free from the law of sin and death.
- 2 Corinthians 5:17: Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!
- Psalm 34:7: The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and he delivers them.
- Psalm 91: 14-15: "Because he loves me," says the Lord, "I will rescue him; I will protect him, for he acknowledges my name. He will call on me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will deliver him and honor him."
- James 4:7: Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.
- Isaiah 41:10: So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

Peter wrote at the end of his letter (1 Peter 5:12) "... I have written to you briefly, encouraging you and testifying that this is the true grace of God. Stand fast in it." 'THIS IS THE TRUE GRACE OF GOD. STAND FAST IN IT!


Our Lady of the Holy Rosary Lost Nation/Toronto
