

As you know, our Diocese is going through a process of discernment and prayer for a renewed enthusiasm to carry out the mission of Christ to individuals and communities around us. We pray for a renewal of the Holy Spirit in our lives to become active participants of Christ's mission.

In a few days, all Parish Evangelization Teams (PETs) of the Diocese of Davenport would be required to write to the Bishop and detail at least two

unique mission oriented activities that we are implementing to actualize the vision 2020 objectives for our parishes. We are to come up with at least two unique actions that will help us reach out to people in our area. It is in the light of this that I am beginning this conversation to elicit your ideas and suggestions. Let us all reflect on the task of bringing Christ's message to people and discern what the Spirit is saying to us as a family of God.

The followers of Jesus gathered in the Upper Room fifty days after Easter; -- Pentecost. They weren't there to grieve over the One who had died, risen and ascended. They were there to wait. Today is the birthday of the Catholic Church.


