




BECOMING AN AMERICAN

The Sisters of St Francis Franciscan Peace Center will hold a free film screening of Becoming an American on Thursday, June 20th, at 6:30pm at The Canticle, 841 13th Avenue North in Clinton.

Becoming an American is a series of short films which gives us a glimpse into the stories of people whose lives have been touched by immigration: from refugees and families to Border Patrol agents and immigration judges. Together, these stories help us understand what it is like, away from the daily news headlines.

In the past, the political consensus about immigration in America was essentially that we are a nation of immigrants, made stronger by our diversity. While Democrats and Republicans differ how to regulate the flow of newcomers to our shores, thought leaders across the spectrum have embraced immigration as an integral component of America's greatness.

Between 1900 and 1915, more than 15 million immigrants arrived in the United States. This was equal to the number of immigrants who had arrived in the previous 40 years combined. The principal source of immigrants was European especially Italy, Scotland, Ireland, Austria, Poland, Jewish, Germany, and Russia, countries quite different in culture and language.
