



Weeds Among the Wheat - God's Infinite Mercy

Mankind: Lord, it is irritating in the Parable of the Wheat & Weeds that weeds be allowed to grow together until the wheat ripened. It was a dreadful waste.

Jesus: My child, you know that parables are to teach you a lesson and the lesson is about life. You are right in saying that it irritates you to let the weeds grow with the wheat, but the weeds and the wheat represent different types of people. What matters to me is how you treat other people. The parable about the weeds in the wheat is a lesson from me on how you should treat other people.

Mankind: I did not know it was a lesson on how to treat other people. From what I could see, Lord, when you gave that parable, I thought you were teaching that at the end of time, those who did not live good lives will be punished. Lord, if you don't mind me saying so, that is mighty strange. You admit that there is a warning to scoundrels in the parable about judgment so what is the parable saying to good people?

Jesus: There is a judgment awaiting everyone when they die and while some people may see that warning in the parable what I really wanted to do in that parable was to advise good people. Those good people that you mention, how are they living their lives? Who is their model for living? Do they follow me?

Mankind: Lord, you know we want to do what pleases God, and when you were on earth during the three years of your ministry you revealed to us what pleases your Father and what pleases you. You mean that those who are trying to follow your ways should be patient with those who are not trying to follow your ways.

Jesus: In this parable I revealed what pleases God, and how you are to relate to others. You said it irritates you that the weeds are allowed to grow in the midst of the wheat. But when you see both the wheat and the weeds, remember view them as people, to be patient with sinners. God never closes the door to anyone. People may close the door to God, but God never closes the door.

Mankind: Thank you, Lord. That reminds me of the time when they were going to stone the adulterous woman outside the town, but you intervened and said, "Let him who is without sin cast the first stone."

Jesus: Yes, leave judgment to God. I want you to have an attitude of mercy towards others just as my Father and I do towards you. The world may say 'Pull up the weeds." But my Father and I say, "Let the weeds and wheat grow together until judgment."

Mankind: That reminds me also of the Parable of the Prodigal Son. The Father was waiting for the prodigal son to return.

Jesus: Yes, but the really sad part in that parable was the elder son who refused to go the party for his younger brother because of his brother's past. I am delighted to see that the parable makes a lot more sense to you now. The parable is teaching about the Church. The Church is not to be just a country club for saints but a hospital for sinners.

Mankind: This is the first time I have heard the Church described as not being a country club for saints but is a hospital for sinners. Lord, I am beginning to think that our problem is that we have absolutely no idea of your mercy.

Jesus: Excellent, and in the Parable of the Weeds & Wheat, I am asking you not to judge, leave that to God. I am asking you to be merciful as my Father and I are merciful. I will conclude with the words that struck you most. The Church is not a club for saints but a hospital for sinners. If there is one sinner left, I am still on the cross offering my life to the Father for this sinner.
