Sacred Heart Parish Meeting

A second pivotal meeting was held, at the Sacred Heart Church, after the Mass, on Sunday January 10th, 2021. In attendance was the Dubuque Archbishop Jackels, accompanied by Jeff Henderson. He is the Director of pastoral planning and leadership development, for the Archdiocese of Dubuque. He will be working, with our Parish, in July 2021. Also, present were the Trustees, the Finance committee, Council members and Members of the Sacred Heart Catholic Church. The continuation meeting was, for discussion and to gather the final information and summarizing key points were covered. A hand vote, of the entire Congregation present was held, with the options given by Archbishop Jackels earlier. The net favorability and affirmative vote---winning. By a majority vote of 43 hand votes, with no objections, therefore; Sacred Heart Parish will be under the leadership, of our Home Archdiocese of Dubuque, in the future. (We had shared, with the Diocese of Davenport, since 1996.) Rev. Greg Bahl will hold weekly Masses, at Oxford Junction, Iowa. Archbishop Jackels of Dubuque and Bishop Zinkula of Davenport will negotiate the finalization, of the terms. This is subject to some variance. Submitted by Kathleen M. Mizaur
