

Draving the Bible

On Tuesday, January 20 parishioners from the Holy Family cluster gathered together to practice *lectio divina*. Too often, our prayer life consists of recitation and talking to God without spending time listening to God and resting in His presence. Our God is always inviting us into a deeper relationship, a sacred encounter. Through prayer, we speak to God, and through the Scriptures, God speaks to us.

Lectio divina literally means "holy reading," but it is much more than a way to read scripture. It is an encounter with Jesus Christ, the Word of God incarnate, and the practice of *lectio*

divina helps us in our mission to grow closer to Christ and to become better missionary disciples. Our evangelization team is planning several gatherings for parishioners in the coming months to meet and learn about this ancient prayer practice.

Each session should take about one hour. If you cannot attend each time, no problem. Come whenever you can. Take that first step!

Pope Francis met January 13 and January 16 with U.S Bishops who were on their 'ad limina' visit to Rome. During 'ad Limina' visits, Bishops present themselves before the Pope to give him accounts of their dioceses. This also affords the Bishops an opportunity to visit the tombs of the Apostles and to show reverence to Peter's successor.

The Pope offers his counsel to the Bishops on their roles as teachers of the faith. This year, the Holy Father emphasized the need to teach the principles of the Christian faith and to walk the talk. We pray for all our Bishops that they may always be strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit in their duties as shepherds of Christ Church.
