



Let us never forget Mary's promise, "In the end my Immaculate Heart will triumph."

The Rose is not only the most beautiful of flowers because it is symbolic of love, it is also a weapon, a barbed weapon with thorns ... so is our Rosary this month is a call anew to us all to pray the Rosary even if it is one single decade ... pray, pray, pray the rosary and slowly medidate each mystery. *With Love ...*
