PASTOR SPEAKS

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Dear Friends,

We have just come full circle in the Church's Liturgical Year as this weekend marks the Feast of Christ the King. We will begin another Liturgical Year 2024-2025 next weekend with the First Sunday of Advent.

Let us look forward to the coming year; let us strive to be pilgrims of hope, embracing each day as people who have been chosen by God's grace and are faith-filled and joyful.

Consequently, the readings for celebrating Christ the King are from Reading I—Daniel 7:13-14; Responsorial Psalm—Psalm 93:1, 1-2, 5; Reading II, Revelation 1:5–8; Gospel—John 18:33b–37. Together, these readings highlight some eternal realities about Christ.

1. Christ as the Lawgiver:

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is Lord, and He has dominion over all of the created order and the universe. Also, Jesus Christ is the Truth who testifies to nothing other than the truth. These two lofty attributes of Christ do not stand in opposition to each other. Instead, there is an authentic synergy between Christ's dominion and Lordship, and are directed towards humble service and empathy towards the restoration of His creation.

Therefore, the church reminds us to recognize Christ's supremacy as Lord and worship and obey His teachings. Thus, Pope St. John Paul II asserts that "man's freedom 'abides' in the truth and conforms to human dignity." (Veritatis splendor, 42).

2. Christ's Kingdom:

In one of his reflections about Jesus as King, Pope Francis sought to encourage extend the Christ's kingdom of love in these words:

This is Jesus, who came without duplicity, in order to proclaim by his life that his Kingdom is different from the kingdoms of the world; that God does not reign in order to increase his power and to crush others; he does not reign by force of arms. His is the Kingdom of love: "I am a king", but of this Kingdom of love; "I am a king" of the Kingdom of those who give their lives for the salvation of others.

The Church Bears Witness to Truth:

Jesus gave us His Church to bear witness to the Truth. As Christians, we are expected to bear witness to the truth as well. We can do this in two ways: the first way is to speak the truth with both charity and courage. Such witnessing can be done by speaking to others or listening to them. The second way is to open ourselves up to the possibility of encounter with truth through dialogue with others.

May Christ kingdom come to us, Amen!
