Job Summary

The Installation Expert must perform various tasks involving physical labor at the job sites. Physical duties may include cleaning, digging trenches, setting braces and properly disposing of waste materials. They assist other team members in the successful completion of the project.

Job Duties

- Clean and prepare construction sites to eliminate possible hazards.
- Load, unload, or identify building materials, machinery, or tools, distributing them to the appropriate locations, according to project plans or specifications.
- Follow instructions, or specifications to determine work activities.
- Control traffic passing near, in, or around work zones.
- Signal equipment operators to facilitate alignment, movement, or adjustment of machinery, equipment, or materials.
- Maintain clean work area, tools, equipment and other equipment used in work assignments
- Comply with all company/job site health and safety policies and personal protective equipment (PPE) requirements

- Ability to use standard construction tools including but not limited to; Hammers of all varieties, screw drivers, drills, utility knife, shovels, tape measure, laser, lifting straps, chains, lifting couplings, or any other tools used in the field.

Physical Abilities

This position is situated in the field. The job duties require performing physical activities that require considerable use of your arms and legs and moving your whole body.

- Ability to continuously sit, stand, walk, crawl, bend, stoop, crouch, twist and turn for up to 8 hours
- The ability to bend, stretch, twist, or reach with your body, arms, and/or legs
- Use of hands/arms/fingers to push, pull, reach, twist, lift and lower objects
- Ability to work in confined work environments and tight spaces
- Work in areas that are extremely bright or inadequately illuminated
- Regularly perform some repetitive motions
- Ability to wear specialized personal protective equipment such as respirator, gloves, safety goggles, hard hat, and body protection equipment
- Lift and carry up to 85 pounds frequently
- Ability to safely ascend and descend (climb) ladders
- The ability to keep your hand and arm steady while moving your arm or while holding your arm and hand in one position
- The ability to keep or regain body balance or stay upright when in an unstable position
- The ability to quickly move your hand, your hand together with your arms, or your two hands to grasp, manipulate or assemble objects.
