

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING LEGISLATION TO CREATE THE WISE REGIONAL WATER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Wise County is currently experiencing rapid population growth and is expected to see substantial population growth for many years to come; and

WHEREAS, several governmental entities in Wise County formed the Wise County Mayors Coalition Steering Committee ("WCMCSC") to work on addressing the water, wastewater, and waste needs of the citizens of Wise County created by the significant population growth; and

WHEREAS, the WCMCSC has brought to the Wise County Commissioners Court's attention the WCMCSC desires to support the creation of a regional water district in Wise County by requesting the state legislators that represent Wise County file and work with the Texas Legislature to enact legislation to create a district during the Regular Session of the 89th Texas Legislature; and

WHEREAS, the Wise County Commissioners Court recognizes the importance of establishing a regional water district in Wise County to provide for the water, wastewater, solid waste, and liquid waste needs of the citizens of Wise County; and

WHEREAS, the Wise County Commissioners Court supports the creation of the Wise Regional Water District, a conservation and reclamation district pursuant to Article XVI, Section 59 of the Texas Constitution, and believes it would be beneficial to the citizens of Wise County.

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that the Wise County Commissioners Court hereby agrees with the need for legislation to create the Wise Regional Water District, and hereby expresses its support of such legislation to the elected state legislators who represent Wise County at the Texas Legislature.
