"Many blessings and Mother Nature are on our side! The Community Arts Center has been fortunate to move full speed ahead with the M. Josephine Paul Family Museum. We have completed the exterior walls of the first floor, poured the second floor and foundation floor, and are partially completed with the second-floor exterior walls. It is our optimistic hope that we will be underroof in the near future. This two story, 5,500 square foot addition will extend from the current Goldhaber-Fend Fine Arts Center, adding the M. Josephine Paul Family Museum, a black box theatre, outdoor amphitheater, and a multipurpose room. For the progress of the Goldhaber-Fend Fine Arts Center renovations, the new carpeting has been 60% installed in the gallery, the HVAC system has been updated, and the lobby and hall have been freshly painted, with new dropped ceiling, gallery lighting, and the remainder of the gallery carpeting to be installed in April."

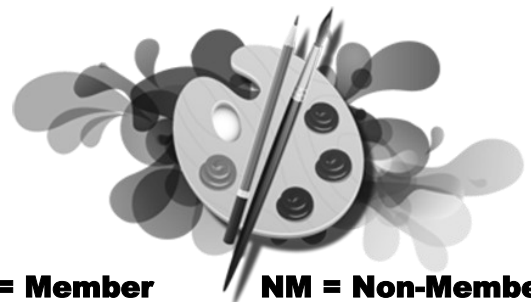

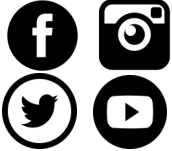
